SEVENTH AND EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORTS OF THE

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

WORK OF THE COMMISSION.

The Seventh and Eighth Annual Reports of the Commission cover a period of two years beginning December 1, 1918, and ending November 30, 1920, and show the necessity and value of the work of the Commission to the people of the State.

PUBLIC SERVICE MAINTAINED.

Prior to the time when the United States declared war on Germany, the cost of materials and labor had been steadily increasing, and after the declaration of war the cost of materials, labor and money so quickly increased that many of the public utilities of the State faced bankruptcy and receivership with an entire abandonment or material reduction of their service, unless immediate relief should be granted in the way of increased rates for their service.

The rates of the public service companies having been fixed by statute, franchise ordinances, or Commission orders, prior to the war, so as to allow only pre-war expenses and a limited return on the investment, it is apparent that they could not secure the necessary labor, materials and supplies, with which to serve the public at war prices without also an increase of their rates, and the Commission realizing the necessity of service to the public by the railroads, express companies, street railroads, telegraph and telephone companies, electric light, gas, water and heating companies of the State, has granted increased rates to such utilities whenever it has appeared after investigation that the same were necessary to enable the utilities to serve the public.

As a result of the Commission's orders, the utilities in this State have been able to grant living wages to their employees, strikes have been avoided especially in the large cities, and the public has continued to receive service which was essential not

only to the successful prosecution of the war but to the health, business, comfort and convenience of the people; and if further proof of the wisdom of our policy in keeping the utilities going were needed, it will be found in the fact that the President of the United States, the Secretary of the Treasury, and the Comptroller of the Currency issued a special appeal to the State Commissions and local authorities to treat these utilities fairly and maintain them at their maximum efficiency as a part of our national equipment for the prosecution of the war.

Had not the Commission permitted the utilities to raise their rates to meet the increased cost of operation, there would have been curtailment of service and receiverships for utilities in many parts of the State, with large receivership expenses and even higher rates to be paid by the public, and it was much better for the public that the Commission should grant the necessary increases in the rates.

TEMPORARY INCREASES ONLY.

While it was necessary and the duty of the Commission to permit the utilities to raise their rates to meet the increased cost of operation, yet the Commission has been careful to protect the public against exorbitant rates after the war prices shall have passed away by putting in the increased rates of the utility in each case for a temporary period only, usually for one year, with an express reservation in the order of jurisdiction on the part of the Commission to reduce or readjust the rates in accordance with the utility's operating expenses at the expiration of the temporary period or at any other time that the conditions may permit.

While it has been charged that certain other lines of business have been "profiteering," that is, making unreasonable profits during the war, it is certain that the public utilities have not, since under the law they cannot raise the rates for their service without an order of this Commission, and no order has been issued by the Commission permitting a utility to charge an unreasonable rate. While the increased rates granted utilities in some instances may have seemed high to some persons, no increased rate has been granted without a full investigation of the merits, or in excess of the amount necessary to enable the utility to meet the increased cost of operation and render service. It is a known fact that the operating costs of utilities, including labor, copper, steel, coal, coke and oil have increased from 50 to 400 per cent

and there have necessarily been substantial increases in the rates of the companies in many cases. But the fact that the utilities cannot raise their rates without the consent of the Commission is a guaranty against their "profiteering."

CHANGING FRANCHISE RATES.

The Commission itself divided upon the question whether we may permit an increase of the franchise rates of street railways, three of the Commissioners holding that we may do so and two holding to the contrary. The opinion of the minority was based upon the contention that the cities were authorized by Section 20 of Article XII of the Constitution to fix an unalterable rate during the life of the franchise, while the majority of the Commission held that the police power of the State to regulate rates was reserved to the State by other provisions of the Constitution and that the Commission acting for the State could exercise its superior power to change the rates whenever necessary to secure adequate street car service. The two cases involving street car fares in St. Louis and Kansas City, in which the Commission divided in opinion, have been passed upon by the Supreme Court of Missouri and it was held by unanimous vote of. the judges of the Court that it was within the power and duty of the Commission to change these rates, and the order of the Commission in each case was fully affirmed by the Court. Louis v. Public Serv. Com., 276 Mo. 509, and Kansas City v. Public Serv. Com., 276 Mo. 539.

There has been no division of opinion, however, in the Commission upon its right to permit an increase of the franchise rates of other utilities, such as telephone, electric light, gas, water and heating companies, and our decisions that we may permit an increase of the franchise rates of these utilities whenever necessary to enable the utility to meet its operating costs and render service to the public, is also fully sustained by the decision of the Supreme Court of this State and generally of the other states. The Supreme Court of this State has set the question at rest in two decisions, (State ex rel. City of Sedalia v. Public Serv. Com., 275 Mo. 201, holding that the Commission might permit an increase of the franchise rates of a water company at Sedalia; and City of Fulton v. Public Serv. Com., 275 Mo. 67, holding that the Commission might permit an increase of the franchise rates of a telephone company at Fulton), and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania has aptly summed up the holding of the courts

generally on the question in 243 Pa. 415, 90 Atl. 199, wherein the court says: "In many jurisdictions it has been held that a contract as to rates is subject to modification or abrogation by legislative action, either direct or through the medium of a commission. Indeed, it must be conceded that the whole trend of modern decision is in this direction."

The power to regulate the rates and service of the railroads and other public utilities of the State belongs to the Legislative Department of the State and the Commission acts as an agency of the Legislature under power delegated to it by the Legislature. The power is exercised by the Legislature or by the Commission as its agent under the police power of the State and it is held by the courts that the cities and towns which are merely subdivisions of the State, cannot contract away the superior power of the State to regulate the public utilitites of the State whenever necessary.

A city or town and a public utility operating therein may enter into a franchise agreement as to the rates and service of the utility and the franchise will be a valid and binding agreement between the city and the utility until such time as the State may elect to modify it, but under the law the State acting through its Commission may raise or lower the rates specified in the franchise whenever necessary to promote the public interest.

The rule that the State may raise or lower the rates of a public utility specified in a franchise agreement between the city and the utility is not a new or strange doctrine, but it is a rule of the law as old as the police power of the State itself and it has been exercised in many cases by this and other State Commissions to lower as well as raise the franchise rates of utilities. It is also the part of wisdom that this power should be lodged and reserved in the State to the end that the public may secure adequate service by a necessary increase of the franchise rates or may be protected against extortion by reduction of an exorbitant franchise rate. Without such supervisory power of the State, the public might be denied utility service essential to its welfare or might be required through a long franchise agreement entered into between the city and utility to pay exorbitant rates throughout a long-term franchise.

Where rates have been agreed upon in a franchise between a city and a utility, the State Commission should be slow in changing them, and this Commission has never changed a franchise rate except upon proof of necessity after a careful investigation, but the State should never surrender its time-honored power to regulate the rates and service of its public utilities whenever it is necessary to do so.

Many franchises have been granted by the cities of this State to utility corporations for periods running from twenty to fifty years and the utilities serving the public and consequently the public itself would be in an unfortunate condition if the rates named in the franchises were unchangeable during the long term of the franchise; and we think the fact that there was a State Commission with the experience and power to properly adjust the rates of the utilities during the war emergency and thereby secure service for the public, demonstrates the wisdom of reserved power in the State to modify franchise rates.

It is true that the terms of a private contract between individuals and private corporations cannot be changed without consent of the parties to the contract, but under the law a franchise agreement between the city and the public service corporation is not the same as a private contract. The courts properly lay down the rule that the public is interested in the service and rates provided for in such franchise and that it must be understood that such agreement is always made between the city and the company with the implied power of the State to make such changes as may be necessary to secure adequate service for the public.

LARGE VOLUME OF WORK BEFORE COMMISSION.

Missouri is not only one of the big States of the Union but it has an unusually large number of large cities and towns with an unusually large number of important utilities operating therein. It also has a large number of railroads, express companies, sleeping car companies, telegraph companies and telephone companies operating outside of the cities and towns, and when it is considered that the Commission is charged with the duty of regulating the intrastate rates and service of all the railroads, express companies, sleeping car companies, telegraph companies, telephone companies, street railroads, electric light, gas and heating companies operating in the State, it must appear that the work of the Commission is necessary and important to the people of the State and that the Commission must be amply maintained and supported to enable it to efficiently perform this important work.

The cases handled by the Commission are designated as informal cases and formal cases. The informal cases consist of the complaints that are usually handled and adjusted by correspondence without a formal hearing and order by the Commission and a large number of important matters are adjusted in this informal way by the Commission. The formal cases consist of the more important cases wherein the Commission is required to make an investigation and issue a formal order, and the large volume of work transacted by the Commission will appear from the following table showing the number of formal cases disposed of by the Commission.

It thus appears that the Commission disposed of an average of 45 formal cases per month during eleven months of the present year, 1920, and that the volume of work before the Commission is increasing. While the volume of work before the Commission is very large, the Commission has been able to dispatch the work before it promptly and keep up with its docket.

COST OF STATE REGULATION.

The total expense of the Public Service Commission to the State, including all salaries and expenses, after crediting the fees collected and turned into the State Treasury by it, has averaged less than \$75,000.00 per annum during the eight years of its existence, which is a small cost compared with the large volume of work done by it.

The entire civil and contingent expenses of the Commission for the years 1913 to December 1, 1920, are as follows:

The Public Service Commission Act provides that the Commission shall collect and pay into the State Treasury certain fees for its orders authorizing the issuance of stocks and bonds by public utilities, and it will be found that after deducting the fees collected from the total expenses of the Commission, that the entire cost of the Commission to the State has averaged less than \$75,000 per annum during the eight years as above stated. And in addition to the above fees in the sum of \$308,136.43, which have been directly collected and turned into the State Treasury by the Commission, there have been paid into the State Treasury as the result of the orders of the Commission requiring the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company and the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company to reincorporate under the laws of Missouri the following fees for incorporation: Louis-San Francisco Railway Company, \$225,025; Missouri Pacific Railroad Company, \$150,025; so that on the whole the cost of the Commission has been small to the State.

STATE OR CITY REGULATION.

Unfortunately, the war came on soon after regulation by the State Commission was established, resulting in necessary and unavoidable increases of rates by the Commission which has brought about criticism of the State Commission Act, and a demand for its repeal from certain quarters not altogether fair and unprejudiced. The demand now most frequently heard is for a return to the old system of municipal regulation, but this would be a backward and unfortunate step for the people of the State to take.

It is essential to the public welfare that there be regulation of the rates and service of the public utilities of a big state like Missouri, and experience has demonstrated that the power should be vested in an impartial, unprejudiced and experienced State Commission. Realizing the necessity of regulation, the General Assembly of this State in 1907 (Secs. 9568-9570, R. S. Mo. 1909) conferred the power of regulating the rates of the local street railway, telephone, electric light, gas, water and heating companies upon the cities of the State, but regulation by the cities after a six-year trial was found to be unsatisfactory, and in 1913, the act conferring power on the cities was repealed and the power vested in a State Commission.

Cities and towns cannot regulate the rates and service of railroads, sleeping car companies, express companies, telegraph and long distance telephone companies operating beyond their limits, or efficiently value the properties or supervise the issuance of the securities of public utilities, and experience has shown that it is much better to combine the power of regulating all the public utilities of the State in a State Commission which is in continuous session, devotes all of its time and study to the question of utility rates and service, is aided by its experts on engineering, valuations, accounting, rates and service, is removed from politics and local prejudice and therefore fair and impartial, and which proceeds in all of its work and hearings without regard to the technical rules of practice or evidence with the sole purpose of securing just and adequate service for the public in return for fair and reasonable rates.

That the work of regulating public utilities is difficult and technical, requiring constant study and application by a Commission and its experts, was demonstrated by the fact that several of the cities of this State established their own commissions during the time they were authorized to regulate certain of their local utilities; and it is not only better to combine the power over all the utilities in a State Commission in order that the findings and orders of the Commission may be authoritative and effective, but it is also better from the standpoint of economy and uniformity of regulation. It will cost much less to have the work done by one commission than by many commissions, and it will be better to have uniformity rather than conflict and confusion of regulation throughout the State.

The necessity and wisdom of having an impartial and efficient State Commission is now established by the fact that 47 of the 48 states, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, and the Philippine Islands, each has a similar state or central commission, and Missouri would take a distinctly backward step should the Legislature now fail to fully support the Commission or repeal or weaken the Public Service Commission Act as has been suggested in some quarters. The necessity for an experienced State Commission during the reconstruction period when so many rates will have to be readjusted throughout the State, will be greater than ever before, and instead of impairing the Act or the powers of the Commission, there should be every disposition at this time especially to aid and strengthen the Commission.

The Public Service Commission Law of this State is a progressive act which embraces the best provisions of the acts of the other states and is regarded as one of the best and most thorough

Public Service Commission Acts in the United States, and it would be a distinct loss to the State should it be seriously weakened or impaired by amendments. The Supreme Court of this State in an opinion by Judge Lamm (254 Mo. 534) has said of the Act: "That Act is an elaborate law bottomed on the police power. It evidences a public policy hammered out on the anvil of public discussion. It apparently recognizes certain generally accepted economic principles and conditions, to wit, that a public utility (like gas, water, car service, etc.) is in its nature a monoply; that competition is inadequate to protect the public, and, if it exists, is likely to become an economic waste; that State regulation takes the place of and stands for competition; that such regulation, to command respect from patron or utilityowner, must be in the name of the over-lord, the State, and to be effective must possess the power of intelligent visitation and the plenary supervision of every business feature to be finally (however invisibly) reflected in rates and quality of service. . . The Act, then, is a highly remedial one, filling a manifest want, is worthy of a hopeful future, and on well-settled legal principles is to be liberally construed to further its life and purpose by advancing the benefits and retarding the mischief struck at. He who reads that Act and does not see a complete rounded scheme for dealing with the business of public utilities at every spot where the shoe pinches the public or the utility, reads it to little purpose."

Only one amendment tending to cripple the Act has been enacted by the Legislature and that was the amendment adopted in 1917 by which municipally-owned water plants were taken out from under the jurisdiction of the Commission, and results have shown that this was an unfortunate amendment, especially for the smaller cities and towns that own their water systems. Commission has rendered much valuable aid and assistance to the municipal plants of the State, especially to the smaller towns and cities, with reference to their rates, keeping their records and accounts, purification of water, and other matters which they were not equipped to handle, and many municipal water plants have requested and received valuable assistance from the Commission even since the amendment of 1917. While it has never been necessary under the Public Service Commission Act to obtain the consent of the Commission to construct and operate a municipal plant, yet the regulation of the rates and service of municipal

plants after construction was wisely placed under the jurisdiction of the Commission and this has resulted in much benefit to both the consumers and to the municipal utility.

VALUATION OF PROPERTY, ETC.

One of the purposes of State regulation by a State Commission is to fix the rates of all public utilities so that the utility may be entitled to earn and the public required to pay rates only upon. the fair value of the property actually devoted to the public use, and during the eight years of the Commission's work it has inventoried and valued with the aid of its engineers and accountants the property of many utilities in this State with an aggregate property value of many millions of dollars. The Commission purposes to proceed with the valuation of the other utilities in this State as rapidly as possible and the value and importance of these valuations is not alone in the fact that they furnish a basis for regulating the rates and service of the utilities but also the basis for taxation by the State of the property of the utilities. It has been said that the valuation of this vast property by the Commission is in itself worth more to the people of the State than the entire cost of the Commission.

One of the many places at which the Commission has fixed the value of public utility property, and as an example of its work, is at the City of St. Joseph, 8 Mo. P. S. C. 394. The St. Joseph Railway, Light, Heat and Power Company claimed that the value of the property in its street railway, electric light, and heating departments amounted to \$11,521,639.00 and the Commission fixed the value of the property in all of the Company's departments on which the public should pay rates at the sum of \$5,800,000.00, or at approximately one-half the value claimed by the Company. The decision of the Commission in the St. Joseph Case has just been enjoined by the United States District Court upon petition of the Company on the ground that the Commission's decision was too favorable to the public, but the Commission will appeal the case to the Supreme Court of the United States for final decision.

Another important effect of State regulation is that public service corporations may not now issue stocks, bonds or securities without an order of the Commission. Prior to the passage of the Act, the public service corporations could issue their securities without an investigation of the value of the property back of the

issues, but under regulation by the State Commission before these stocks, bonds or securities may now be issued, an application is filed with the Commission, a hearing is had, and the company is permitted to issue only such securities as may represent the real value of the property, and the company is required to keep and devote the proceeds of the securities to the service of the public.

As a result of the jurisdiction of the State Commission over the issuance of stocks, bonds and securities by public service corporations the "water" is being squeezed out of such property in this State and the public is relieved of paying rates on "watered" stocks, bonds and securities. The investors in these stocks, bonds and securities are also greatly benefited in that they know that the securities issued under the supervision of the Commission do not exceed the real value of the property and that the proceeds of the securities are kept in the properties against which the securities are issued. In this feature also, the magnitude of the work of the Commission appears from the fact that the Commission has supervised the issuance of such securities in the last eight years aggregating many millions of dollars.

SIMPLE PRACTICE BEFORE COMMISSION.

One of the commendable features of Commission regulation is the simplicity of the practice and procedure before the Com-While much discussion has been going on the last few years of needed reforms in the rules of procedure before the courts, such reforms have actually been put into practice before the Public Service Commission. Any citizen of the State may file his own complaint and conduct his own case before the Commission, and the hearing before the Commission is conducted without regard to the technical rules of evidence or practice obtaining in the courts, with the result that the Commission is able to ascertain the essential facts and administer justice much more quickly, economically and efficiently under its simple form of practice than it could do under the technical rules of evidence and practice obtaining in the courts. While many of the decisions of the Commission have been reviewed in the courts no claim has ever been made in any review proceeding in court that the simple form of practice before the Commission has operated injuriously or prejudiced the rights of any one, and the simplicity of the practice has been uniformly commended by the attorneys and parties having cases before the Commission.

COMPETENT ENGINEERS, ACCOUNTANTS AND RATE EXPERTS.

The Missouri Commission has been fortunate in being able to employ competent and skillful engineers, accountants, and rate experts for its technical departments, and it has been largely through their untiring aid and assistance that the Commission has been able to promptly dispatch the large volume of business handled by the Commission during the last eight years, and all have served the State at modest salaries and with fidelity to the public interests.

HISTORICAL

Appointments—Time of Service of Each Commissioner—Membership of the Commission to December 1, 1920.

The law creating the Missouri Public Service Commission was introduced in the legislature by Senator William G. Busby, of Carroll County, and provides that its effective date shall be April 15, 1913; that the Commission shall consist of five (5) members, who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, one of whom shall be designated by the Governor to be chairman of the Commission; that one of said Commissioners shall hold office for two years, two shall each hold office for four years, and two shall each hold office for six years; that upon the expiration of each of said terms each Commissioner thereafter appointed shall be commissioned for a term of six years; and that vacancies in the Commission shall be filled by the Governor for the unexpired term.

Effective April 15, 1913, there were appointed:

FRANK A. WIGHTMAN, railroad expert, of Monett, Mo., for a term of two years, ended April 15, 1915.

JOHN KENNISH, lawyer, Kansas City, effective August 23, 1920, was appointed for unexpired term ending April 15, 1921. Resigned, effective December 1, 1920.

GENERAL OFFICE.

War conditions, or the period of reconstruction following the close of the war, brought a heavy increase in business to the general office of the Commission, as was the case with many of the other state departments. The high cost of everything which went into the construction of plants of the various utilities and the abnormally high wages paid employes had to be cared for and reflected in the rates charged. Steam railroads, street railroads, local and long distance telephone plants, electric, gas, water and telegraph companies have each in turn appeared before the Commission for relief. Managing officers, legal representatives and operating officials, together with representatives of the public appeared before the Commission that each

phase of the question might be most carefully gone into. Taking everything into consideration the Commission decided, of necessity, temporary relief must be affored and in every case the increased rates were fixed for a stated period, jurisdiction being retained that further orders might be made and rates brought back to pre-war basis as soon as business conditions make it possible.

The future of the public utilities is still a matter of grave concern. People are not disposed to do without these conveniences which have grown to be everyday necessities, yet many of them, through lack of knowledge of the true situation, are prone to object to advances or to the retention of present rates pending business adjustments.

FORMAL SESSIONS OF THE COMMISSION.

The two years covered by this report have been busy ones. Three hundred and ninety-six of the 731 days included in this period have been devoted to formal hearings at which one or more of the Commissioners presided, or which were conducted by special examiners named by the Commission for that purpose. Seven heads of departments, including the Secretary, have been called on to help care for the vast volume of business handled. The more important cases have been heard at the office where all the Commissioners could be present. It is the general practice, however, for the Commission to go to the place where complaints arise, that all witnesses may have an opportunity to present their evidence.

SPECIAL AUTHORITIES.

This general head covers rates which have been put in on less than statutory notice, to prevent a hardship falling on the utility concerned, as well as the patrons thereof, when the Commission, after careful investigation, is satisfied that immediate relief must be furnished. They largely refer to steam railroad rates but others have been issued when necessity demanded.

FORMAL CASES DOCKETED

From December 1, 1918, to December 1, 1919, 378 formal cases were docketed most of which have been brought to final decision. For the year ended December 1, 1920, 564 formal cases were docketed and have been finally passed on where possible so to do or are in process of final determination. The above shows that the work of the Commission has practically doubled during the last year.

LEGAL DEPARTMENT.

The department, constituted as heretofore, consists of the General Counsel and Assistant Counsel to the Commission and one stenographer.

The following shows the nature of the proceedings had in in the various suits begun, pending or disposed of, which have been in charge of this department during the biennial period ending November 30, 1920:

1. Kansas Natural Gas Case: This litigation has been the most protracted of all in which the department has been engaged. At the time of the making of the last annual report, this suit brought in the U. S. District Court for the District of Kansas by John M. Landon, as receiver of the Kansas Natural Gas Company, against the Commissions of Missouri and Kansas and numerous cities, was pending in the Supreme Court of the United States on appeal taken by the Public Service Commission of Missouri et al. and had recently before been argued in the Supreme Court on behalf of the Commission.

In April, 1919, the Supreme Court of the United States rendered its decision, reversed the judgment of the District Court and remanded the cause for further proceedings in the latter court. The decision of the Supreme Court sustained the contention of the Public Service Commission that the sale of natural gas by the local companies in Missouri was not interstate commerce and that the local companies, in the sale of natural gas, were subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.

At a hearing held on the 8th of June, 1919, at Minneapolis, Judge Wilbur F. Booth, the Judge sitting in the case, held that the parties might file amended pleadings, and an amended and supplemental bill was filed by the plaintiff and answer to this has been filed on behalf of the Public Service Commission, and an answer in the cause has been filed to the cross-bill against the Public Service Commission embodied in the answer of the Kansas City Gas Company. A hearing was held at Minneapolis, Minnesota, on April 15, 1920. A brief on behalf of the Commission was made and filed. The Court has not yet made a final disposition of the case.

2. Union Pacific Fee Case: This case at the time of the last annual report was also pending in the Supreme Court of the United States upon a writ of error taken from the Supreme Court of Missouri. It involved the legality of the payment of a fee of \$10,962.25 assessed by the Commission and paid into the State Treasury by the Railroad Company based upon a bond issue submitted by the Railroad Company to the Commission and approved by the Commission.

The Supreme Court of the United States on the 9th day of December, 1918, rendered a decision reversing the judgment of the Supreme Court of Missouri and reversing the action of the Commission. The Legislature at its session in 1919, made an appropriation returning this money to the Railroad Company.

- 3. Caruthersville Train Case: This case involves the validity of the order of the Commission concerning train service to be rendered by the St. Louis-San Francisco Railroad Company at Caruthersville, Missouri. At the time of the last report, the case was pending in the Supreme Court of Missouri on appeal by the Railroad Company. On the 15th day of March, 1919, the Supreme Court of Missouri rendered its decision affirming the order of the Commission and appeal has been taken by the Railroad Company to the Supreme Court of the United States. The case has been briefed, and by agreement of counsel it is to be submitted on briefs at the December Call, 1920, of the Supreme Court.
- 4. Sedalia Water Company Case: At the time of making of the last report, this case had been taken by the City of Sedalia to the Supreme Court of the United States upon a writ of error to the Supreme Court of Missouri. This department prepared and filed in the Supreme Court of the United States a

motion, and brief in support of the motion, asking that the writ of error be dismissed upon the ground that no substantial Federal question was presented. The motion was sustained by the Court on the first day of March, 1920.

5. Kansas City Railways Fare Case: At the time of the making of the last report, this case involving the validity of the order of the Commission raising fares of the street railway company in Kansas City had been argued and submitted in the Supreme Court of Missouri. On the 31st day of December, 1918, the Supreme Court handed down its decision sustaining the order of the Commission. An appeal was taken by the City of Kansas City to the Supreme Court of the United States.

On the 13th day of September, 1919, a motion with brief in support thereof was filed in the latter court asking that the case be dismissed upon the ground that no substantial Federal question was involved. On the 10th day of November, 1919, the Supreme Court of the United States sustained this motion, and thereby sustained the right to change street railway fares fixed by franchise.

- 6. Fulton Telephone Case: This case involving the validity of an order of the Commission raising rates in the City of Fulton above those specified in a franchise had been taken at the time of the making of the last report to the Supreme Court of the United States upon a writ of error sued out by the City of Fulton. A motion and brief in support of the same was filed in the Supreme Court of the United States in this case, asking that the writ of error be dismissed upon the ground that no substantial Federal question was involved. The motion was sustained on the first day of March, 1920.
- 7. Missouri Southern Railway Mandamus Case: This was a suit brought for the Commission to compel the Railway Company to operate certain spur tracks which it was threatening to abandon. The case was briefed and orally argued upon the appeal of the railway company at the April Term of the Supreme Court, 1919. On the 9th day of July, 1919, the Supreme Court rendered its decision sustaining the action of the Circuit Court of Jefferson County which had issued its peremptory writ of mandamus against the Railway Company.
- 8. Missouri Southern Rate Cases: At the time of the making of the last annual report, this case was pending

in the Supreme Court of Missouri upon appeal taken by the Railway Company from a judgment of the Circuit Court of Jefferson County which sustained an order of the Commission fixing rates for service over certain industrial tracks. The case was heard on appeal at the April Term, 1919, and on July 9, 1919, the Supreme Court handed down its decision affirming the judgment of the Circuit Court and the order of the Commission.

- Carthage Spur Track Case: This is a case of long The Southwest Missouri Railroad Company, street railroad company operating in the City of Carthage, brought this proceeding to review an order of the Commission dismissing an application of the Company for permission to abandon certain of its tracks in the City of Carthage. Circuit Court of Cole County affirmed the order of the Commission. The Company appealed and the appeal was heard at the October Term, 1918, in Division No. 1 of the Supreme Court. The judges in that Division were divided in opinion and the case was transferred to court in banc. Additional briefs were made and the case orally argued before the Court in banc at the April Term, 1919. Before a decision was reached, a change occurred in the personnel of the members of the Court, and the case was set down for argument before the Court in banc the second time and was again argued at the January call, 1920. Court reversed and remanded the case.
- 10. United Railways Company of St. Louis Fare Case: This case similar in character to the Kansas City Railways Fare Case was, at the time of the making of the last report, still pending for decision in the Supreme Court. That Court rendered its decision on the 19th day of December, 1918, affirming the order of the Commission.
- 11. Aurora Interlocker Case: This is a suit brought by the Commission in the Circuit Court of Cole County against the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company and the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway for a writ of mandamus compelling the defendants to construct an interlocking plant at the crossing of their lines at Aurora, Missouri, in obedience to an order made by the Commission against the predecessor companies of the present owners. The predecessor companies, against which the order was made, were the Iron Mountain and the old Frisco Companies before the sale of the properties under reorganization proceedings. The Circuit Court of Cole County

upon a hearing in August, 1918, entered judgment for the Commission awarding the writ. Appeals were taken by the two railway companies. The case was heard upon appeal in the Supreme Court in banc at the April Term, 1919. The Court sustained the action of the Court below in awarding the writ against the Missouri Pacific Company, but not as against the Frisco Company.

- 12. Pilot Grove Train Service Case: This suit brought by the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railway Company to set aside an order of the Commission requiring additional train service at Pilot Grove was, at the time of the making of the last report, pending in the Supreme Court upon appeal taken by the Railway Company. The Supreme Court on March 4, 1919, handed down its decision affirming the order of the Commission.
- 13. Southwestern Bell Telephone Company Toll Case: On the 21st day of January, 1919, a suit was brought for the Commission in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, to enjoin and restrain the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and its associated companies in Missouri from putting into effect increased rates and new regulations prescribed by the Postmaster General. A restraining order was obtained and later, upon a hearing, a temporary injunction was granted by the Court. Upon final hearing of the case in May, 1919, the temporary injunction was made permanent enjoining and restraining the defendants from putting into effect rates for long distance service in Missouri other than those prescribed by the Public Service Commission. An appeal was taken to the Supreme Court of Missouri by the telephone companies.

On the 2nd day of June, 1919, the Supreme Court of the United States in the case of Dakota Central Telephone Company vs. State of South Dakota, involving the same issues, rendered its decision holding that state supervision over intrastate telephone rates ceased with the exercise by the President of his authority under joint resolution of Congress on July 16, 1918, and thereafter this suit was dismissed in the Supreme Court of Missouri by stipulation.

14. Postmaster General Telephone Rate Case: This was a suit brought by the Postmaster General, Burleson, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri to enjoin the Public Service Commission from interfering with local exchange rates for telephone service

prescribed by the Postmaster General to be charged in about eighty cities in Missouri for local exchange service by the local telephone companies affiliated with the Bell Telephone System.

The case was heard upon the application for an interlocutory injunction before U. S. Judges Stone, Van Valkenburgh and Woodbrough at Kansas City, Missouri. The application of the Postmaster General was denied, a majority of the judges being of the opinion that the authority given to the Postmaster General did not suspend the exercise of the power of the Commission to fix rates for local telephone service. Before the case came on for final hearing, the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States in the South Dakota case, above mentioned, had been rendered and upon the authority of that decision this suit was dismissed by the parties by stipulation.

- 15. Aufder Heide Mandamus Suit: This suit was brought in the Circuit Court of Gasconade County to compel E. H. Aufder Heide, the owner of a telephone system at Bland, Missouri, to install telephone equipment in the station of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad Company at Bland and furnish service thereover pursuant to an order of the Commission theretofore made. The case was heard at Hermann, Missouri, on the 28th day of July, 1919, and a peremptory writ of mandamus was issued by the Court requiring the defendant to install a telephone and render service in obedience to the order of the Commission.
- 16. Webb City Water Case: This is a suit brought by the Webb City Water Company in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, to review an order of the Commission requiring the Company to make certain extensions of mains and of service in Webb City. This case has not been heard pending certain negotiations which have been had between the City and the Company.
- 17. Union Electric Light and Power Company Cases: These cases, eighteen in number and of like character, were brought in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, in April, 1919, by certain large consumers of the Company in the City of St. Louis to review and set aside an order of the Commission preventing an increase by the Company in rates for heat furnished. These cases were heard together on the 31st day of October, 1919. Later the Circuit Court set aside the

orders of the Commission. Appeals are pending in the Supreme Court, before Court in banc January Call, 1921.

18. Moberly Subway Case: This was a suit brought for the Commission in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, against the Wabash Railway Company, the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railway Company, the Director General of Railroads and the City of Moberly for a writ of mandamus compelling the defendants to reconstruct the subway crossing of Rollins Street in the City of Moberly at the intersection of that street with the lines of the two railway companies.

Upon the hearing, the Circuit Court of Cole County at its August Term, 1919, rendered judgment for the plaintiff, Public Service Commission. An appeal to the Supreme Court was taken by the railway companies, and later the appeals were dismissed. The work ordered is being done.

19. Joplin and Pittsburg Railway Fare Case: This is a suit brought in the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri by the Joplin and Pittsburg Railway Company against the Public Service Commission to set aside an order of the Commission made effective September 8, 1919, fixing rates of fares to be charged by the railway company upon defendant's intra-state passenger business and to enjoin and restrain the Commission from enforcing its said order.

The application of the railway company for an interlocutory injunction was heard at Kansas City on the 16th day of October, 1919, by U. S. Judges Stone, Van Valkenburgh and Wade. On the 10th day of November, 1919, the Court handed down its decision and made its order granting an interlocutory injunction. After the passage of the Federal "Transportation Act," the company again came before the Commission, and such orders were made as resulted in a dismissal of the suit in court.

20. Mountain Grove Train Service Case: This is a suit brought by the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway in the Circuit Court of Cole County to review and set aside an order of the Commission requiring the company to stop certain of its passenger trains at Mountain Grove. The case was heard at the August Term, 1919, and the Circuit Court sustained the order of the Commission. An appeal to the Supreme Court was taken by the railway. The case was briefed and orally argued at the April Term, 1920, but no decision has yet been rendered.

- 21. Second United Railways Fare Case: This is a suit brought on the 16th day of October, 1919, by the City of St. Louis in the Circuit Court of the City of St. Louis to review and set aside an order of the Commission permitting the railway company and its receiver to increase fares to eight cents. This suit has not yet been heard, and it is confidently expected that it will be dismissed by the City.
 - 22. Kansas City Light and Power Company Heating Rate Case: This is a suit brought on the 28th day of November, 1919, in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, by Mary B. Case et al. to review and set aside an order of the Commission fixing rates for electric and heating service to be charged by the Kansas City Light and Power Company. The Circuit Court sustained a motion challenging its jurisdiction. The Supreme Court in mandamus proceeding held the Circuit Court of Jackson County had jurisdiction. The case was set down for hearing for December 15, 1920.
 - 23. St. Joseph Railway, Light, Heat & Power Company Case: This is a suit brought by the company mentioned in the United States District Court to enjoin the Commission from enforcing its orders fixing the valuation of the properties of the Company and fixing rates to be charged for service. The company claims a valuation approximately double that allowed by the Commission. The case was tried at the March Term, 1920, and later briefs filed. The Court on November 10, 1920, rendered a decision sustaining in the main the contentions of the Company and enjoining the Commission. An appeal will be taken to the Supreme Court of the United States.
 - 24. Southwestern Bell Telephone Case: This case arose out of the orders of the Commission made November 26, 1919, cutting out certain charges for installation and moving of 'phones established by the Postmaster General, and making slight reductions in some of the Company's local exchanges below the charges in force under the orders of the Postmaster General. The Company procured a writ of review from the Circuit Court of Cole County. That Court, upon hearing, sustained the Commission, but, upon the application of the Company, suspended the Commission's order pending hearing and pending appeal, requiring the Company to give a bond and impound in bank, monthly, the excess charges collected. The annual excess charges were estimated to aggregate the sum of

two hundred thousand dollars. The case on appeal is set for hearing before the court in banc at the January call, 1921, and involved in addition the issue upon rates, highly important questions concerning valuations.

- 25. Capital City Water Company Case: This is a suit by the Company owning the waterworks system in Jefferson City to review and set aside the orders of the Commission fixing the valuation of the company's property, and also prescribing rates. The Circuit Court of Cole County sustained the orders of the Commission. The Company has appealed and the appeal is docketed for hearing at the January call, 1921, of the Court in banc.
- 26. Willow Springs Switch Track Case: This is a suit to compel the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company to construct and operate a switch track for the Creamery Company at Willow Springs in Howell County. The order for the track was made while the railroad property was under the control of the Director General. The case was heard by the Circuit Court of Henry County on the 26th day of October, 1920. A brief has been made and filed in behalf of the Commission but no decision has yet been rendered by the Court.
- 27. Webb City and Carterville Water Case: This is a suit brought in the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri, by the Missouri Public Utilities Company, owner of the waterworks systems at Webb City and Carterville, to enjoin the Commission from enforcing certain orders as to rates, and from interfering with the Company putting in higher rates. An interlocutory injunction was granted by Judge Van Valkenburgh. The case has not yet come on for trial upon final hearing.
- 28. Richards Switch Track Case: This is a suit brought in the Circuit Court of Jackson County by J. F. Richards of Kansas City to set aside an order of the Commission directing the Union Pacific Railway Company to switch cars over a track extending from the tracks of the Union Pacific Company across Hickory Street in Kansas City; thence across the rear end of lots owned by Richards, and over the rear end of other lots in the same block severally owned by other persons.

The contention of Mr. Richards is that the portion of the track over his lots is his private property; that without his consent the railway company cannot run cars over this

portion of the track to reach the more distant lots; that he is entitled to charge the other owners of lots a rental. The case has been set down but has not yet been heard.

- 29. Festus Train Service Case: This is a suit brought in the Circuit Court of Cole County by the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company to review and set aside an order recently made by the Commission requiring the company to stop certain of its passenger trains at the town of Festus in Jefferson County. A return has been made to the writ and an early hearing of the case will be had.
- 30. St. Joseph Gas Company Case: This is a suit brought by the City of St. Joseph to review and set aside an order of the Commission prescribing charges for gas, and particularly regulating the service, or "ready to serve," charges to be made. The writ was sued out of the Circuit Court of Buchanan County and made returnable December 4, 1920. A return has been made and the suit will reach an early hearing.
- 31. Blue Springs Light and Power Case: This is a suit by the Blue Springs Light and Power Company brought in the Circuit Court of Jackson County to review and set aside an order of the Commission granting to the Green Light and Power Company a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate in the City of Blue Springs. The writ was made returnable December 2, 1920. A return has been made and an early hearing will be had of the case.
- 32. Ozark Power and Water Company Case: This is a suit brought by the Ozark Power and Water Company to annul an order of the Commission requiring the Company to extend its line into the unincorporated town of Diamond, in Newton County, and to furnish light and power to the inhabitants of the town.

The Circuit Court of Cole County sustained the order of the Commission. The Company appealed, and the case was submitted to the Supreme Court at October, 1920, call of the Supreme Court.

Work as Special Examiners: In addition to having charge of all matters in the courts, a member of this Department has been appointed upon several occasions Special Examiner to take the testimony and prepare findings thereon in cases brought before the Commission. This has been found necessary to be

done by reason of the unusual number of cases coming before the Commission under the abnormal conditions existing for many months and also on account of the policy of the Commission to have hearings held as far as it may be possible in the town or city where the interested parties are located. The Department has also prepared opinions in writing upon questions submitted to it by the Commission and has, whenever requested, drawn formal applications or complaints to be submitted to the Commission by parties concerned.

RAILROAD DEPARTMENT.

The personnel of this Department comprises a chief, one assistant and a stenographer.

This Department has direct supervision over the rates and service conditions, other than grade crossings, of the railroads, express and pullman companies.

This Department represents the Commission before the Interstate Commerce Commission in rate matters and prepares the testimony and exhibits, submits the case at the hearing and prepares the briefs for final submission.

General Conditions: From January 1, 1918, to and including February 29, 1920, the Federal Government was in control of practically the complete railroad mileage of Missouri and under ruling of the Supreme Court of the United States, State Commissions had no authority in rate matters during such period of The railroad properties were returned to their private owners effective March 1, 1920, with a Government guarantee that the net earnings of the respective companies would, for a period of six months, be equivalent to the average net earnings for the three years prior to the assumption of control by the Government. Rate advances were not necessary during this test period and it is estimated that the Government guarantee cost the people of the United States \$600,000,000.00. guarantee period the carriers filed applications with the Interstate Commerce Commission, this Commission and various other State Commissions asking for such an advance in rates as would be equivalent to a return of six per cent upon the values of all properties devoted to transportation service. 26, 1920, the order of the Interstate Commerce Commission, which granted these increases, became effective upon interstate traffic, and upon October 1, 1920, the order of this Commission, granting such increases, became effective. Freight rates were advanced 35 per cent, except that upon Missouri state traffic, the carriers were limited to such an advance, as when coupled with advances granted by the Director General, during his period of control, would not result in a rate applicable October 1, 1920, that was in excess of 170 per cent of the rate that was in effect June 24, 1920, upon heavy and low grade commodities such as coal, brick, cement, sand, gravel, etc. Passenger rates were increased 20 per cent which practically resulted in the establishing of a rate of 3.6 cents per mile and a charge for pullman service was made which was equivalent to 50 per cent of the pullman rate, this revenue to accrue to the railroads.

Pullman: Shortly after return of the pullman properties to the Pullman Company an application was filed for an increase of rates. The Commission thoroughly investigated this application and found that the pullman fares had not been increased since the establishment of the original charges but on the contrary one material reduction had been made. A thorough analysis of the Missouri state traffic was made and it was found that the business in Missouri was being conducted at a net financial loss and the Commission authorized all seat fares in pullmans to be increased to a minimum charge of 50 cents and berth fares to be increased 20 per cent, the increases to be figured as the next 25 cents. This practically resulted in every berth fare in Missouri being raised 50 cents and making the minimum charge for a lower berth \$2.00.

Express: Like the railroad and pullman companies the express companies came out from under Federal control showing operation of properties at a loss. During the period of the war all of the express companies operating in Missouri and the principal express companies operating within the United States were consolidated into one company and with the cancellation of duplicate service in the various towns it would appear that service would have been performed at a much lower cost than before the war, but due to the unionizing of all employes of the express companies during the period of Federal control with the resulting establishment of the eight hour day for all employes, it required practically as many people to perform the services as were required where duplicate service was performed and with much higher wages. The Interstate Commerce Commission authroized a total increase for account of the express companies amounting to 26 per cent in its rates. This Commission

investigated the express condition independently of the investigation made by the Interstate Commerce Commission and found that the service could not be continued with the then existing rates. After the conclusion of the war the United States Labor Board ordered increase in wages to express company's employes which aggregated 13 1-2 per cent of the total gross revenues of said companies and after a thorough investigation this Commission authorized a similar advance.

The three increases above outlined represent the principal increases granted to utilities under the supervision of this Department during the calendar year 1920.

Formal cases involving rates of service were not so numerous as in the years prior to Government control but among the principal matters handled by the Commission the following may be given as fair examples:

Missouri State Fair: The railroads advised the Fair Association that no reduced rate fares would be authorized for persons attending the 1920 Exposition at Sedalia. Formal complaint being filed by the State Fair Board, hearing was held and the carriers were ordered to promulgate a round trip fare of one and one third times the one way fare. The order was complied with.

Fish Cars: During the period of Federal control the Director General withdrew all special rates for the movement of Government and State owned fish cars used for the free distribution of fish to the waters of Missouri and other states. Upon return of the railroads, to their private control they declined to reinstate these special rates and upon complaint being filed by the Missouri State Fish Commission this Commission ordered the carriers to obey the 1917 law which requires the free distribution of these cars. The order was complied with.

Express Service At St. Louis: Upon proper complaint being filed and hearing had the Commission ordered the express company to so extend its free delivery limits in St. Louis as to embrace an additional territory approximately one and one-half miles wide and four miles long. The order was complied with.

Informal Handlings: A large portion of the work of this Department is handled informally. Complaints are made that rates are improperly adjusted and upon examination this Department ascertains if the complaint is well founded and the matter is taken up with the carriers and in the majority of cases a satisfactory adjustment is reached.

Complaints of train service and depot facilities being inadequate, lack of proper facilities for the handling of live stock, insufficient track space at various stations and all matters of this kind are first handled informally and in ninety per cent of all cases handled an adjustment is secured and as a result a formal case does not appear upon the Commission's records. One of the best illustrations of this handling is a recent proposition of the carriers to withdraw from their tariffs provisions for free return of exhibits moving to State and County Fairs. The State Fair Association was of the opinion that if this privilege was withdrawn it would materially reduce the number of exhibits at the State Fair and detract from the educational facilities thus provided. This matter was handled informally by this Department and the proposition of the carriers was withdrawn. These handlings go well into the hundreds and one handling of a subject of this kind has its influence all over the state, as a precedent is thus formed and the complaint so adjusted is reflected at other stations.

Car Shortages: During the summer months of 1920, the car shortage in the United States and Missouri was more acute than at any time in past history. During the period of Federal control the Government did not add equipment as had been done in previous years and due to the forced use of equipment in the movement of troops and munition the actual condition of equipment was far below normal. It became necessary for the Interstate Commerce Commission to establish committees at various points in the United States to carefully watch the distribution of empty cars and to insure the prompt handling of all equipment. The chief of this Department was a member of the committee at both St. Louis and Kansas City and every effort was made to see that cars were equitably pro-rated to all.

Coal Situation: In the late summer and early fall coal conditions had reached a critical point. The Interstate Commerce Commission had ordered the carriers in certain territories to distribute a certain number of cars daily either to the Great Lakes for distribution into the northwest or to the Atlantic Sea board for distribution to the New England States and these orders coupled with the heavy demand for coal both for the use of steamers and for export trade resulted in the Illinois mines securing orders at unusually high prices for the shipment of their tonnage to hitherto unused destinations. It was reported that one large manufacturer in Michigan sent a purchasing agent

into Illinois to purchase 1,000 cars of coal. Illinois had never shipped, in the past years in any volume to Michigan. The situation became so acute that the Governor asked this Commission and the Attorney General to go into the situation and as a result of a conference held with the railroads and the Illinois coal operators, a committee was established consisting of representatives of the railroads and the coal operators with Mr. Henry Miller, President of the St. Louis Terminal Railroad as Chairman, and the work of this Commission has been such that the flow of coal from the Illinois mines to the eastern part of Missouri has been in sufficient volume to insure a reasonable supply of coal for the ensuing winter.

ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT.

This department consisted of a Chief Engineer, seven assistant engineers and one stenographer during 1919. Resignations during 1920 reduced the assistant engineers to four in number. The duties of the Engineering Department consist of:

- (a) Appraisal of all properties over which Commission has jurisdiction.
- (b) All matters relating to investigation of accidents on steam and electric railways.
- (c) All matters relating to protection, alteration and elimination of grade crossings.
 - (d) Inspection of steam and electric railway properties.
- (e) Investigations to determine necessity and safety of switch and sidetrack connections.
- (f) All matters relating to steam and electric railway signal systems and interlocking plants.
- (g) All matters relating to steam and electric railway clearances.
- (h) All matters relating to street railway traffic studies and service.
- (i) Investigation relative to applications for certificate of convenience and necessity, filed by steam and electric railways.
 - (j) All drainage investigations.
- (k) All investigations relating to necessity of filtration of water supplies, intakes, etc., and approval of plans for same.

Appraisal of Property of Public Utilities: The appraisal of the property of the United Railways Company was started

in February 1919, and the field work completed about August, 1920. The work is now completed except for typing. Appraisals of the properties of the Ash Grove Electric Light and Power Company, Hannibal Railway and Electric Company and the Citizens Gas Company of Hannibal will be completed before January 1, 1921. During the month of December 1920, the Engineering Department will start work on the appraisal of the gas, electric and street railway properties at Sedalia and the property of the Kinloch Telephone Company at St. Louis.

Investigation of Accidents on Steam and Electric Railways: Steam and electric railways are required to wire immediate report of accidents. These messages are followed by detailed report of accident. At the end of each month a summary of all the accidents that have occurred during that month is filed with the Commission.

A careful investigation is made of all wrecks and accidents resulting in injury or death. The purpose of these investigations is to determine the cause and to apply corrective measures, rather than to fix the blame.

As a result of such investigations many highway grade crossings have been protected.

Protection, Alteration and Elimination of Grade Crossings: The following crossings have been investigated, and where conditions warranted protective devices, such devices have been installed or are under consideration:

DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS AND ACCOUNTS.

During the year ended November 30, 1919, the regular personnel of this department consisted of a Chief Accountant, two expert Accountants, two assistant Accountants and a Stenographer. Two additional assistant accountants were employed part of the time on the audit of the United Railways Company of St. Louis.

During the year ended November 30, 1920, the two extra accountants were dispensed with and one of the regular Assistants resigned to accept a more remunerative position in New York City and owing to the great scarcity of qualified accountants we were compelled to function as best we could with a depleted force. The regular activities of the department might be classified as follows:

- 1. Audit of books and records of Steam Railroads, Electric Railroads, Express Companies, Telephone Companies, Gas, Electric, Water and Heating Utilities, in order to ascertain Original Cost, Capitalization, Income, Expenditures, Operating Statistics and Rate of Return earned, to be used in Valuation, Capitalization and Rate Making cases.
- 2. Drafting Accounting Systems and forms of Annual Reports for Utilities.
- 3. Analyzing Accounting and Statistical exhibits and Evidence presented by Utilities in Valuation, Capitalization and Rate Making cases.
- 4. Compiling Financial and Operating data from Annual Reports of Missouri Utilities for Other Commissions, Municipalities, Civic Leagues, Traffic Associations, Utilities, Brokers, Attorneys and sundry petitioners for such information.
- 5. Compiling Comparative Statistical data from Annual Reports of Utilities.
- 6. Examining and Recording verified Semi-Annual Reports of realization from Bond and Stock issues authorized by the Commission and the distribution of such proceeds.
- 7. Advising verbally and by correspondence the various Utilities in matters pertaining to Accounts and Statistics.

Audits Made During the Year Ended November 30, 1919:

Caruthersville & Kennett Electric Light & Power Co., Kennett, Mo.—An audit of the books of the above named Company was undertaken at the solicitation of the Company's patrons in order to ascertain the reasonableness of increased rates effective November 1, 1918. The Operating Revenues, Operating Expenses and the Net Profit on Operations for the years of 1917 and 1918 as well as the Original Cost of Plant to December 31, 1918, were ascertained and presented in evidence by a member of the Commission's Accounting Staff.

Kirksville Gas, Heat & Electric Company.—Pursuant to the filing of a schedule of proposed increases in rates, effective June

20, 1918, the Commission ordered an audit of the operating records of this Company. The Operating Revenues, Operating Expenses and the Net Profit on Operations for the calendar year of 1918 were ascertained.

Brookfield Electric Light Company.—An audit of the books and records of the above Company was made during the early part of 1919. The Investment in Plant and Equipment to December 31, 1918, the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the calendar years of 1917 and 1918 and the Surplus Account from January 1, 1913, to December 31, 1918, were analyzed, Exhibits prepared and presented in evidence at a hearing held at Jefferson City.

Jackson County Light, Heat & Power Company, Independence, Mo.—The books of the above Company were audited during January, 1919, pursuant to an application by the Company for an increase in rates. A comparative Profit and Loss Account for the two calendar years ended December 31, 1918, was prepared. The Operating Revenues and Expenses were analyzed and the Additions and Betterments to Plant since May 31, 1916, date of a previous audit by Commission Accountants, were secured, exhibits prepared and presented in evidence.

Independence Waterworks Company, Independence, Mo.—Pursuant to an application for increased rates, filed by above Company March 11, 1919, the Accounting Staff made an audit of the books of the petitioner and prepared an Income Statement reflecting the Operating Revenues, Operating Expenses and Net Profit on Operations for the calendar year of 1918 and the 3 months ended March 31, 1919. They also prepared a statement of Classified Operating Expenses in detail for the same period as well as detailed statistical exhibits of water pumped, sold, used by Company and lost and unaccounted for.

St. Joseph Gas Company, St. Joseph, Mo.—An audit of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the six months ended June 30, 1919, with a special investigation into the Cost of Coal and Coke and Oil purchased, used and on hand was ordered by the Commission. This audit grew out of a radical divergence in the operating results of the Company as shown by accounting representatives of the Company and of the City of St. Joseph when hearing was held on the reasonableness of existing rates. Various exhibits were prepared by Commission's Accountants and presented in evidence.

Home Telephone Company, Centralia, Mo.—Pursuant to an application for an increase in rates, effective January 1, 1919, the Commission ordered an audit of the records of above Company. The Accounting Department prepared a Profit and Loss Account for the twelve months ended July 31, 1919, as well as statistical exhibits pertinent to the case.

Norborne Fuel, Ice & Light Company, Norborne, Mo.—An audit of the above Company's records was made to ascertain the result of operations under increased rates. The period audited covered the year ended May 31, 1919. A Profit and Loss Account, Statistical Exhibits and a statement of Additions and Betterments to Plant were prepared and presented in evidence by a member of the Accounting Department.

United Railways Company of St. Louis.—A complete audit of the Plant and other Balance Sheet accounts, as well as the operating records of the above Company was undertaken in February, 1919. Practically the entire Accounting Staff was moved to St. Louis and continuously engaged on this work. Individual accountants were occasionally withdrawn temporarily to handle urgent accounting matters in other parts of the State, but the audit of this Company's records represented the major part of the Staff's activities during the year. From four to six men were kept constantly on the work and it was unfinished at the close of the year ended November 30, 1919.

Audits Made During the Year Ended November 30, 1920:

Hanamo Telephone Company, Maryville, Mo.—Pursuant to an application for an increase in rates an audit was made of the Plant Account to December 31, 1919, and of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the calendar years of 1918 and 1919. Our report presented Plant and Equipment, Profit and Loss and detailed Operating Expense schedules. Report was presented in evidence and testified to at the hearing held in the case.

Edina Light Company, Edina, Mo.—Account application for rate increase an audit of the Plant Records to December 31, 1919, and of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the calendar years of 1918 and 1919 was made. A separation between Light Plant and Ice Plant operations was necessary in this case.

Maryville Electric Light & Power Company, Maryville, Mo.—Owing to increased rate application an audit of the Plant Records to December 31, 1919, and of the Operating Revenues

and Expenses for the years of 1918 and 1919 was ordered. Our report was prepared, presented and testified to at hearing of rate case.

Kelso Telephone Company, Fornfelt, Mo.—Due to increased rates applied for we audited the books and records of the above Company, prepared a Profit and Loss Account for the year 1919 and secured such data as was ascertainable upon the Plant Costs. Certain consumers data requested was furnished in our report.

Holden Home Telephone Company, Holden, Mo.—Account rate increase applied for an audit of the Plant Account to December 31, 1919, and of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the year 1919, was consummated and report presented in evidence at hearing of case.

Brookfield Electric Light Company, Brookfield, Mo.—A supplementary audit, for the purpose of ascertaining the additions to Plant during the year 1919 and the Operating Revenues and Expenses for same year was made. This report was testified to at hearing of case.

Green Light & Power Company.—Due to application for increase in rates an audit was ordered of the books of the above named Company. The Plant records to December 31, 1919, and the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the year of 1919 were audited. As the rates applied for affected seventeen towns it became necessary to apportion Expenses applicable to each locality. This involved various bases of apportionment and entailed considerable work.

United Railways Company of St. Louis.—The audit of this Company's records was completed during the early part of April, 1920, and the Accountants returned to Jefferson City... However, the preparation of the final schedules of Plant, Securities, Operating Results, Statistics and writing the report required considerable time and this report was finally completed in June, 1920.

Missouri Electric R. R. Company.—This railroad, known as the St. Charles Line, is owned and operated by the Missouri. Electric R. R. Co., but all its stock and bonds are owned by the United Railways Co. of St. Louis. The audit of its Road and Equipment Records and Operating Revenues, Expenses and Balance Sheet Accounts proceeded concurrently with our audit of the United Railways Company. Our Report covered the Plant Account to December 31, 1919, and the Profit and Loss

Account for the years of 1918 and 1919. Various Schedules of Operating Statistics were prepared and included in the report.

Citizens Gas Company, Hannibal, Mo.—The Plant and Equipment Records to December 31, 1919 and Operating Revenues and Expenses for the year 1919 and five months ended May 31, 1920 were audited pursuant to an application for increase in rates. Certain statistical data required was also compiled.

Hannibal Railway & Electric Company, Hannibal, Mo.—An audit of the Road and Equipment Accounts to May 31, 1920, and of the Profit and Loss Account for the year 1919 and five months ended May 31, 1920 was made under Commission's order upon application of the Company for rate increase. Various schedules of Statistical data as well as a Surplus analysis from June 30, 1900, to May 31, 1920, was compiled and reported.

Commercial Telephone Company, Washington, Mo.—Due to application for increased rates we audited the Plant and Operating Accounts of this Company showing Plant as at December 31, 1919, and Operating Revenues and Expenses for the calendar year of 1919. This report included Plant Cost and Operating Results of the exchanges at Union, Mo. and Mehlville, Mo. as well as Washington, Mo.

Joplin Water Company, Joplin, Mo.—An audit of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the year of 1919 was consummated within this period. Our report presented Statistical data as well as a Profit and Loss Account and detailed Operating Expenses.

Cape Girardeau Bell Telephone Company, Cape Girardeau, Mo.—The Plant and Equipment Accounts to December 31, 1919, and Operating Revenues and Expenses for year of 1919 were investigated. A separation between Cape Girardeau, Other Exchanges and Toll in both the Plant and Operating Accounts was necessary.

Kansas City Telephone Company, Kansas City, Mo.—In accordance with the Commission's order an audit was made of the Operating Revenues and Expenses of the Company from August 1, 1919, to June 30, 1920 (the period from the consolidation of the Kansas City Telephone Properties to the latest available date). Report was presented and testified to at hearing held in Kansas City. Certain specific questions involved required special schedules which were prepared and included in report.

Lead Belt Telephone Company, Lead Belt, Mo.—An audit of the Plant Records, Operating Revenues and Expenses of above Company was made and the operating results for the period July 1, 1919 to June 30, 1920 ascertained and shown.

Laclede Gas Light Company, St. Louis, Mo.—An audit of the Operating Revenues and Expenses during the twelve months ended July 31, 1920, was made and reported. Our report included certain operating data of manufacture and disposition of Gas, as well as the financial results. This report is to be put in evidence at hearing to be held December 7, 1920.

Pike County Electric Light & Power Company, Bowling Green, Mo.—An audit, growing out of an application to increase rates, was made of the Operating Revenues and Expenses for the calendar year of 1919 and the 6 months ended June 30, 1920. Consumers data was also prepared and included in report.

Caruthersville and Kennett Electric Light & Power Company, Caruthersville, Mo.—An audit of the Plant and Operating Revenue and Expense records of the above Company was made during this period and report presented and testified to at hearing of rate case.

Lafayette Telephone Company, Lexington, Mo.—Account rate increase applied for an audit of this Company's records was made during the fiscal year. The Plant Account to September 30, 1920, and Operating Revenues and Expenses for the year 1919 and 9 months of the year 1920 were examined and shown in our report.

The Accounting Staff is at present engaged in audits of the Joplin and Nevada Exchanges of the Home Telephone Company, as well as of seventeen separate utilities operated by the Missouri Public Utilities Company of St. Louis.

During the year ended November 30, 1920, the Accounting Department spent considerable time analyzing exhibits of the Western Union Telegraph Company presented in their application for increased rates. These exhibits involved apportionment of Revenues and Expenses between Trans-state, Interstate and Intrastate operations.

Compiling Comparative Statistical Data: During the two fiscal years under report various statements available from utilities' annual reports were requested by cities, states, brokers, commissions, etc., and were compiled and furnished by this Department at the rates stipulated by law.

Stock, Bond and Note Authorizations: Utilities organized, existing or incorporated under the laws of Missouri may issue Stocks, Bonds, Notes and other evidences of indebtedness payable at periods of more than twelve months after the date thereof, only after securing an order from the Commission authorizing such issue. The order specifies the amount of issue and the disposition of the proceeds. This Department examines all exhibits and documents presented and reports its recommendation to the Commission. The Commission requires semi-annual reports from utilities of the sale of securities and disposition of proceeds. These reports are checked in this Department to ascertain whether all stipulations set forth in the order are met.

The following table shows the applications for security issues received during the periods under review.

DEPARTMENT OF GAS, ELECTRICITY, HEAT AND WATER.

The year of 1919 and the present year, 1920, show very similar characteristics to those years following the close of other wars of any magnitude. It was hoped by some that the prices would show a marked trend downward during the year 1919 and this year, but it was not until the latter part of the present year that prices began to fall to any appreciable extent. The prices of some commodities, and especially the price of coal, increased during the year of 1919 and the early part of the present year. The result of these continued increases required that the temporary rates, which had theretofore been given, be continued for a further period. Furthermore, it has been necessary to allow additional increases over those already given in order that the utilities might continue to operate and render satisfactory service to the public.

During the war the utilities had to curtail purchases of material for replacements and growth. Some of them had very great increases in their demand for service, and this increase has required new construction and reconstruction covering the whole system of their plants. In an effort to take care of the additional demands for service and to carry out the work that normally should have been done during the war, several of the companies have found it difficult to obtain the necessary capital as it was needed and at the same time give satisfactory service. Labor has been scarce and the help available has demanded further increase in wages. Such conditions, as just enumerated, have caused some of the smaller utilities to consider the abandonment of operation altogether. But abandonment of operation has been more strongly opposed by the public than the increasing of rates. The spirit of the public has been to allow the utilities a rate sufficient to meet operating expenses and pay a return on the actual investment used in giving the service.

Prior to the war the price of coal, and in some cases the cost of labor, was so low that it was more economical to operate on plant efficiencies then obtaining than it was to put in more improved equipment and additional machinery in order that greater mechanical efficiencies might be produced. This does not hold at the present time. The relation of fuel and labor cost to total production cost has so greatly increased that plant economies have become much more vital questions than ever before.

While trying to solve the engineering problems of increasing

their capacities and of reconstruction, the utilities have had to ask for increased rates and charges. In some instances it has been necessary to defer the granting of increased rates until the utility had made proper effort to render satisfactory service.

Another result of the war which has required more of the attention of the department than ever before, is the activity now going on in the building of electric transmission lines. These lines radiate from some city, in which a large modern plant is located, to the neighboring towns. The added cost of the transmission lines appears to be less than the losses that would exist in the smaller and less economical plants required to serve the same communities.

Complaints have been filed by citizens asking that the utilities be required to furnish service, which, to give the service, required an extension of the lines. An effort has been made to take care of all these cases and this has been accomplished as rapidly as could be expected. Investigations have been made of the quality of service rendered. It is hoped that more of this kind of service may be rendered. Additional equipment has been purchased and it is hoped that the department will be able to go into more detail in all deserving cases in the future.

Under such conditions this department has been very busy. Additional help could be used very advantageously. If funds were available the department could well use additional expert help in studying and advising in the field the utilities that cannot afford such help. The expense of this work would be more than returned to the public due to the improvements in economy of operation that should follow.

Below will be found a summary of the Gas, Electric, Heating and Water Utilities in this State.

TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.

As in the past seven years, this department consists of the Chief and one assistant. It has jurisdiction over the telephone and telegraph companies in the State of Missouri, particularly in the matter of rates, service, and the complaints as filed by the subscribers and the general public.

On August 1, 1918, by Act of Congress, the Government assumed control of all of the telephone and telegraph companies and placed them under the supervision of the Postmaster-General. For one year they were operated under the jurisdiction of that official, when on August 1, 1919, the Government, by a further act of Congress, returned them to their respective owners with the provision that the rates and rules as authorized by the government should remain in effect for a period of four months or until December 1, 1919, unless otherwise ordered by the Public Service Commissions or other regulatory bodies.

This Commission, during this interim of four months, made exhaustive studies and took the testimony of interested companies and representatives of the various cities with reference to the charges and rules as made by the Federal Government, with the following result:

The twenty per cent increase in the telegraph rates that had been put in force by the government was disallowed, and in its place an increase of 10 per cent was allowed on messages within the State of Missouri on the rates which existed before the period of Government control. These new rates were allowed for a temporary period of thirteen months in order that the telegraph companies might be permitted to prepare and present to the Commission complete inventories showing the value of the property located within the state. Also statement showing the revenues and expenses incurred in handling the business within the state during the above period.

With reference to the rates and charges for telephone service as authorized by the Federal Government, the Commission by its order made the following changes, effective December 1, 1919. The installation charge which was to be collected where a telephone was installed for a subscriber, was disallowed.

The Federal Government had allowed increases and changes in rates in eighty-one of the exchanges within the state. The Commission by its order reduced the rates as allowed in fortynine of the exchanges and allowed the rates in the remaining
thirty-two cases unchanged for a temporary period of thirteen
months unless otherwise ordered by the Commission, provided
that the telephone companies should at the expiration of the
twelve months' period file with the Commission a full and complete report showing the revenues and expenses in each individual case. The Commission during this temporary period made
such investigation as was necessary in order that the telephone
companies might receive a fair rate of return on their investment, and the telephone users and the general public would not
be compelled to pay more for their service than would allow
a fair rate of return to the telephone companies.

The Southwestern Bell Telephone Company secured from the Circuit Court a writ of supersedeas. The case has been appealed to the Supreme Court of this state, the telephone company being allowed by order of the court to collect the installation charge and the rates allowed by the Postmaster General, pending the final decision of this case.

The Federal Government also authorized and put into effect certain changes in the rates as charged for toll messages, several new features being introduced. Under the former method of charging there was but one classification, namely, the particular person call. The rates for this class of service have been increased approximately 12 1-2 per cent above the rates formerly charged, and a new classification known as the two-number service, wherein the calling party asks for a telephone number or name of firm wanted has been established, the rate for which is about 12 1-2 per cent lower than that formerly charged for a particular person call. An evening message rate was also introduced which provides for a reduction of 50 per cent from the standard two-party rate, and is in effect from 8:30 P. M. to 12 o'clock midnight. Between the hours of 12 o'clock and 4:30 A. M., there is another new rate of 75 per cent reduction over the day rate for two number calls. Other charges not heretofore in force have been added, such as a report charge, and an appointment charge. The Commission by its order allowed these toll rates to remain in effect for a temporary period of thirteen months from December 1, 1919, or until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

During the past three years the telephone companies have been unable, on account of the scarcity of material and labor, both of which were being used by the Government in winning the war, to make the necessary extensions in their business, and to keep up the proper maintenance of their plants, etc., and for this reason many of the companies are now asking for increases in their rates as charged for service in order that they may have sufficient funds to take care of the deferred construction and maintenance. We may reasonably expect that this condition will prevail during the coming two years at least.

The changes above mentioned for exchange service, installation charge, toll and telegraph rates as well as the general confusion occasioned by the taking over and returning of the telephone companies to their owners has brought about a considerable increase in the amount of correspondence received in this office, both from the telephone companies and the public, as well as the telephone users in general. These matters being brought forth by the Government's handling of the affairs of the telephone have awakened interest in the public which has heretofore been unnoticable, and the one particular desire of the public appears to be that better service be furnished by the operating companies, and that this to some degree be brought about by the consolidation of exchanges in towns wherein more than one company is operating. The approval of the Commission has already been given to the consolidation of the two companies in Kansas City and Independence, Missouri, the work of which is at the present time being carried on.

Formal Cases: The entire number of formal cases handled by the Commission referring to the telephone and telegraph interests is 371, and as but 40 were pending at the close of the year December 1, 1918, it remains that 341 cases have been presented since that date. This is a far greater number than during any other previous two year period, but is partially accounted for by the fact of the Government's control and release of the various companies occuring during this period.

Informal Complaints: The number of informal complaints received during the two year period is 141, and with 10 at the beginning of the year 1919, made 151 to be disposed of. Out of this number there now remain but 16 to be settled. The number of informal cases received during the two years was as great as during any two year period since the creation of the Commission. Most of these complaints have occasioned the writing of a great many letters before an adjustment of any sort was reached. REPORTS OF THE COMMISSION.

Since the publication of the last Annual Report of the Commission, bound volumes six, seven and eight and the first five advance sheets to volume nine of the Missouri Public Service Commission Reports have been issued. Volumes six and seven and two advance sheets to volume eight were issued during the year ending November 30, 1919, and four advance sheets to volume eight and five advance sheets to volume nine, as well as bound volume eight, were issued during the year ending November 30, 1920. A total of three hundred and sixty three cases are reported in the above publications, being distributed as follows: Ninety-two cases in volume six, ninety cases in volume seven, ninety-one cases in volume eight and ninety cases in the five advance sheets to volume nine. Within their pages are to be found some of the most important rulings of the Commission-notably, those affecting its jurisdiction and the questions of rates and service of public utilities during times of abnormal stress brought on by the War and its continuing effect.

It is the practice of the Commission to enter a report only in the more important cases. In many cases an order only is entered. These are not reported in the above series of reports, but may be found mentioned in the appendices to this—the Annual—report. Such cases form, by far, the greater number of proceedings had before the Commission. Many other matters are treated through correspondence complaints, general orders, conference rulings and informally. Consequently, the reports under discussion are not indicative of the vast amount of work transacted by the Commission.

The Missouri Public Service Commission Reports are of great aid in the efficient management of public utilities within the State, and, in connection with court decisions, form the basis of an interpretation and knowledge of the laws of the State affecting transactions between public utilities and the public. Each decision in the Reports is properly titled, designated by number, headnoted, credited as to authorship, and the representatives of the parties appearing are shown. The volume is indexed, showing cases reported, cases cited, localities affected and subject-matter treated therein. A list of court cases wherein the Commission was a party is also given. Advance sheets are issued that those interested in the decisions of the Commission may have them available without unnecessary delay.

When sufficient material is at hand for the compilation of a bound volume, the same is published, supplanting the advance sheets by a permanent edition of the decisions, compiled for ready reference.

A charge of \$2.50 per volume—based on the cost of publication—is made for these reports. This amount includes receipt of advance sheets and bound volume; no difference in charge being made if bound volume only is desired. A charge of 35c for individual copies of advance sheets is made.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 21 of the Public Service Commission Law, this Commission has collected and paid into the State Treasury during the two years ended December 1, 1920, \$63,232.25.
