On behalf of the Public Service Commission, I have the honor to submit to you our Annual Report for the fiscal year, July 1, 1967, through June 30, 1968.

This has been a year of action for this regulatory agency of State Government. The Commission has been involved in numerous applications for passenger train discontinuations by railroad companies of Missouri. A new natural gas safety order was adopted this year. The Commission has represented Missouri's interests at many federal hearings in Washington.

During the year of this report, the Commission has fulfilled its first year of regulation of sewer utilities under the new law passed by the 74th General Assembly of Missouri. Since this law was enacted as emergency legislation, a detailed report of the enforcement is found in this report. The regulation of sewer utilities reported herein includes the first sewer rate case under the new statute.

The Commission staff in continuing its surveillance of utility and transportation rate matters. At the writing of this report, the staff has been assigned to numerous investigations into revenue requirements of public utility and transportation companies under our jurisdiction. The Commission and its staff are, at this writing, engaged in preparation for rate cases on a number of proposals by major utilities to increase their rates for service. These matters of economic regulation before the Commission at this time are of concern to all Missourians.

This report is an accounting by the Commission of its stewardship for the fiscal year, 1967-1968.

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# THE COMMISSION

## Serving Missouri since 1913

The Public Service Commission In Review - A Summary of Service

The Missouri Public Service Commission today is a modern adaptation of regulatory principles enunciated as long ago as the reign of William the Conqueror. In 11th Century England, wharves, cranes and other conveniences were regulated by the monarchy to safeguard the public interest. Regulation of private property by government then, as now, is based on the concept that private industry ceases to be "juris privati" when the public is limited to one source to obtain a vital service.

In 1875, Missouri legislators made the first definite statement of governmental participation in the economic activities of this state. Those law makers, in organizing the Board of Railroad Commissioners from which the Public Service Commission grew, defined governmental participation as regulation of special areas of the economy which directly influences the welfare of the people and the financial stability of the state.

## Board of RR Commissioners

The Board of Railroad Commissioners 93 years ago was organized to regulate railroads operating in Missouri. In that post-bellum era, the railroad industry was an integral part of Missouri's economic growth and development. The efficiency and stability of railroad service was vital to Missouri's future. Citizens of Missouri

were dependent upon indiscriminate access to railroad services and equitable rates for those services were essential to their welfare. The Board was founded to see that the public interest was protected.

As Missouri grew, so grew the needs of its citizens. In 1889, the Board of Railroad Commissioners expanded its scope of activities to become the Board of Railroad and Warehouse Commissioners. With the new name Legislators gave the Board came the authority to regulate and inspect Missouri's grain warehouses and to control rates charged. In 1893, the Board's regulatory powers were again broadened. This time they were extended to include railway express enterprises operating in Missouri.

## Time of Growth

The 20-year interim between 1893 and the creation of the Public Service Commission marks one of Missouri's greatest periods of change and growth. Naturally, this period of materialistic and social advance is reflected in Legislative change for with all radical changes in activities of society come new rules and principles of law to suit those alterations of conditions.

Public utilities became a part of Missouri's growing economy. With the advent of this industry and its rapid advance came the need for change in administrative law. Regulation was extended by Legislature to include public utility services which, like railroad services, called for governmental controls to protect the public interest.

The setting of rates for services was left to Legislature in the early days of utility regulation. As the industries under the jurisdiction of governmental control became more and more complex, it was evident that economic regulation was a task for the experts. There were no State funds provided for hiring of the necessary technical investigators required to intelligently regulate Missouri's fast-growing utilities. Legislators were not in session at all times. Consequently, there was not the proper time spent on such regulatory matters as customer complaints, requests by utilities for additional revenues, examination of applications to establish new utilities and the numerous other technical and financial problems confronting this area of Missouri's economy. Politics could become a factor when rates were at the sole disposal of Legislation.

## Cities Become Regulators

In 1909, Legislators passed an act giving towns and cities the power to regulate their own local utility rates and establish city utility boards. In 1909 the

General Assembly of Missouri created local commissions for larger cities. These local groups encountered the same difficulties as did the Legislative body. Most cities could not finance the addition of the necessary staff of accountants, valuation engineers, rate experts and other technical personnel.

## Commission Is Created

The 47th General Assembly of Missouri in 1913 was faced with the task of creating a State agency which could be charged with the obligation to regulate Missouri's railroad and utility industries. It sought to establish a Commission which would employ a staff of technically skilled experts familiar with all tools of the utility and transportation fields.

With the founding of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the regulation of public utilities was no longer a Legislative function. The new Commission was given broad jurisdiction and the full power



to regulate not only the practices, but also the rates and security issues of utilities operating in Missouri. The new Commission, through the Commission Act of 1913, was created as a quasi-judicial body beyond the pale of Legislative power to destroy.

The Legislative intent of those farsighted Missourians who passed the 1913 Commission Act is reflected in the name they chose for the new State agency: The Missouri Public Service Commission. It stresses public service and indicates the two-fold purpose of the Commission.

## · A Two-Fold Purpose

First, the Commission was charged with the responsibility to oversee the operation of utilities serving Missourians. That obligation embraces the protection of the interests of all customers, today and those of the future, against inadequate or discriminatory services and exorbitant Second, the investor must also be given the protection of economic regu-The private investor in a utility lation. business must be able to make a reasonable return on moneys he has invested in public service. The Commission strives to find the proper balance between those two areas of interest.

The Public Service Commission was given jurisdiction over passenger motor carriers in 1927. The 56th General Assembly extended that regulation to include motor freight carriers. The Bus & Truck Act became effective on September 14,1931.

Shortly after the effective date of the act, a suit was brought before the U.S. District Court to test the constitutionality of the law. On July 30, 1932, the court sustained the validity of the law and it was not appealed.

## Motor Carrier Regulation

The new legislation added the provision for the Commission to levy certain fees on motor carriers. The Bus and Truck Act outlines the regulation, supervision and inspection of motorized vehicles. Matters of safety and the right to authorize rates and fares are included in this regulatory responsibility fulfilled by the Commission.

As an administrative agency with rule-making powers, the Public Service Commission is obligated to assure Missouri of public utility and transportation industries which will continue to be sound elements of a strong and favorable economic climate. The final responsibility in the fulfillment of its responsibilities rests with its five Commissioners. Each is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate to a six year term. Terms of office are staggered so that no more than two Commissioners' terms will expire during any given year.

## Traditionally Bi-Partisan

By custom, but not by law, the Commissioners are selected on a bi-partisan basis. Three of the members are traditionally from the political party of the Governor and two from the minority party. At this writing, three of the Commissioners are Democrats and two Republican. All five were appointed by Governor Warren E. Hearnes; four to six-year terms and one to fill the unexpired term of a Commissioner who resigned.

The history of service to Missourians by this agency of state government is a proud heritage. The present Commission has strived to continue to preserve that 93year-old heritage.

The Missouri Commission was one of the earliest state commissions organized in the United States. It has long been a Commission whose regulatory decisions are held as exemplary. During the period of this report, the Missouri Commission has received numerous national recognitions for its leadership in the field of economic regulation.

A Congressional moratorium sought by this Commission to halt passenger train discontinuances received national recognition. The staff of the Commission attended 24 hearings before federal regulatory bodies to assure Missourians a voice in federal proceedings when their interests appeared.

## Civic Participation

Commissioners, Directors and staff members serve actively in numerous organizations and on committees in regulatory-oriented efforts at a local, state and national level. Commissioners actively participate in federal investigations and all are members of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners where all are serving on a special committee. The Chairman is a member of the NARUC executive board.

Commissioners and staff participated in national transportation training seminars as instructors during the past fiscal year and it was this Commission which instituted the first, or pilot, school of this nature from which these seminars are patterned (1966). Commissioners have served as regional spokesmen in an advisory capacity in many regional and national concerns.

## Gas Safety Regulations

Missouri, in February of 1968, adopted one of the strongest gas safety codes presently in effect in the nation. This was done prior to the enactment of federal legislative action to develop a national safety code.

## Passenger Train Problems

This past fiscal year, like the early days of regulation, have seen this Commission deeply involved in railroad matters. Passenger train discontinuance applications by railroads were a regulatory concern to the Commission and to the citizens of this state it serves.

At this writing, the Commission has ordered a railroad (Missouri Pacific Railroad Company) to keep the last four passenger trains running between Missouri's two metropolitan cities. This order was issued so the Commission could determine, at the end of six months, if the railroad company's request to curtail this service is or is not in the public interest.

The railroads have also requested certain of its freight agencies be replaced with motorized units traveling from a central point of a given area. Hearings on the proposal for mobile freight agencies are slated across the state at local courtrooms. That decision is pending at the writing of this report.

One area of accelerated activity at the Commission has been the regulation of sewer utility companies. This increased work load was brought about with the enactment of legislation which restated the Commission's control over sewer utility operations in Missouri. A detailed accounting of this emergency legislation signed into law June 1, 1967 may be found in the section from the Office of Utilities in this annual report.

The Commission was involved in a number of cases this fiscal year in which it ordered utility companies to separate city franchise (or gross receipts) taxes from utility bills. This resulted in a reduction in utility bills for some Missourians.

The Commission called for the separation of the taxes and the listing of these taxes on utility bills in communities where the taxes were being levied. This confines the payment of these taxes to residents of the location where the benefits of those taxations are realized. It removes such taxes from the rate structures of com-

panies and results in a savings to some customers.

Cities facing the need for additional funds to operate city government have raised city franchise taxes imposed on utilities to as much as 10 per cent. This had been reflected in utility costs.

## Sign Two Agreements

Still another area of increased activity in the field of transportation regulation was evident with the signing of cooperative agreements by the Missouri Commission and federal regulatory agencies. The agreements have resulted in certain revisions of Missouri's Bus & Truck Act. Although revisions, aimed at making uniform all transportation requirements in

the United States, are incomplete at this time, the staff of the Office of Transportation is working on them.

## Reorganization of 1966

The Commission, at the direction of its Chairman, underwent a major reorganization in 1966. The Commission was reorganized into four distinct offices. Each office is headed by a director whose responsibility it is to see that programs of his division are expeditiously completed. Each director is responsible directly to the Commissioners.

With the initiation of the new methods of operation, the Commission has been able to respond to its regulatory obligations with increased efficiency and speed. It has helped to unify the Commission into a coordinated body which affords the Commissioners easier communication with its staff for consultation on the complexities of modern, economic regulation.

The four offices which make up the staff of the Commission are; The Office of the Secretary; The Office of the General Counsel; The Office of Utilities and the Office of Transportation. A complete accounting of the activities of those Offices are found in this report.

## Statistics on Cases

The Commission during the fiscal year, July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1968, heard 836 cases pertaining to utility and transportation regulation. It issued 5, 263 reports and orders on its decisions. (Those figures do not include the 1,933)

suspension and reinstatement orders involved in motor carrier regulation which required the concurrence of a majority of the Commissioners as other regular orders Nor does it include interstate permits, insurance orders and other interstate matters.) A total of 1,311 applications for some authority involved in regulatory control were filed by Missouri's utility and transportation companies during the past fiscal year. A total of 1,481 utility matters were processed which required the action of the full Commission. A listing of cases may be found at the conclusion of this report. (See Appendix)

At the close of the fiscal year, the Commission is faced with a number of requests for increased rates filed by application or tariff from several utility companies. The cost of money has risen to new heights in the past few months. Labor costs have risen. Materials have increased in price. Taxes have increased. All these

factors are listed by applicants as reasons for the requested increases.

In 1968 the Public Service Commission is responsible for the economic regulation of transportation and utility industries which have become vital to the very foundation of Missouri's economy and to the health and welfare of its citizens. Utilities have extended their boundaries to include almost all areas of the state. Transportation services reach even remote areas of Missouri.

The task of regulating the complex industries over which legislators have given the Commission jurisdiction has become highly technical and requires expert personnel versed in the field of utility and transportation. The conclusions and decisions of this Commission touch the lives of each citizen of this great state, as utility and transportation services have become essentials instead of luxuries.


The regulation of certain areas of the economy which directly influence the welfare of Missourians and the financial stability of this state remains the obligation of this Commission as it has the past 55 years.

## THE CHAIRMAN



WILLIAM R. CLARK

Chairman William R. Clark was Governor Warren E. Hearnes' first appointment to the Public Service Commission. Chairman Clark assumed the position on June 1, 1965.

Prior to this appointment, Chairman Clark was engaged in the general practice of law at Columbia. He had served as Corporation Counsel under the late Secretary of State Walter H. Toberman (1955-1959). A Colonel on Governor Hearnes' staff, he was also a Colonel for the late Governor James T. Blair.

A graduate of the University of Missouri School of Law, the Chairman holds a degree from the University's School of Business and Public Administration. He is a graduate of Kemper Military Academy.

Chairman Clark is a member of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners and has been named to its Executive Committee: Committee on Communications: Committee on Coordination of Congressional Activities and Committee on State Use of Interim Separations Procedures. He serves as a member of the Missouri Highway Reciprocity Commission; Missouri Oil and Gas Council: the Governor's Coordinated Committee on Traffic Safety and is Chairman of the Transportation Task Group of the Missouri Emergency Resources Management Planning Board. He also serves as Chairman of an eight-member committee, The Governor's Railroad - Highway Grade Crossing Safety Committee

A native of Missouri, Chairman Clark was born March 27, 1921. He served the USAFR from 1942 until 1967, retiring from the Air Force Reserves with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.



CHARLES J. FAIN

Commissioner

Commissioner Charles J Fain was appointed to the Public Service Commission on October 1, 1965, by Governor Warren E. Hearnes for a six-year term.

A Republican from Branson, Missouri, he has practiced law since 1951 when he was admitted to the Missouri Bar. He also spent a three-year period in Washington D. C., where he was Assistant to the Administrator, REA. He was a partner in the firm of Fain and Rea, Attorneys at Law, Branson, Missouri, engaged in the general practice, and is a member of the Missouri Bar, Taney County Bar, the Bar Association of St. Louis and the American Bar Association.

He served two terms in the Missouri Legislature as a Representative from Taney County, serving as Speaker Pro Tem his second term. He was the author of the original Legislation creating Missouri's first Little Hoover Commission Act in the 67th General Assembly and later served as a member of that first Little Hoover Commission in Missouri. He holds an LL. B. degree from the University of Missouri School of Law and a masters degree in law from George Washington University, Washington, D. C. He served as City Attorney, Branson, Missouri, for two terms and is a former president of the Branson, Missouri, Chamber of Commerce. He was a combat navigator, U.S. Air Force in World Was II in the Central Pacific Theater of Action. He is now serving as a NARUC Cooperator with the federal regulatory agencies.



MARVIN E. JONES

Commissioner

Commissioner Marvin E. Jones was appointed to the Public Service Commission by Governor Warren E. Hearnes on April 15, 1967. His term of office continues until 1973.

A former Dexter, Missouri, attorney, Commissioner Jones was born June 8, 1921 at Bernie, Stoddard County, Mo. He was graduated from Bernie High School in 1939 and attended Southeast Missouri State College, Cape Girardeau, prior to entering the armed forces.

A World War II veteran, Commissioner Jones served as aerial navigator on B-17 Bombers with the 15th Air Force. He was awarded the Air Medal with four oak leaf clusters and the Purple Heart with two oak leaf clusters for his combat service in Italy. He was discharged in 1945 with the rank of First Lieutenant.

Commissioner Jones received his LL. B. degree from the University of Missouri School of Law in 1950 and then enrolled in that university's school of Business and Public Administration. He served as Claims Attorney for MFA Insurance Co. and was manager of the District Claims Office at Dexter, supervising claim adjustments in the Southeastern Missouri area from 1951 until 1958. In 1958 he entered private practice of law at Dexter forming the Powell, Jones and Ringer law firm.

A past president of the Stoddard County Bar Association, Commissioner Jones was active in numerous civic affairs at Dexter. He was a member of the Board of Deacons of the First Baptist Church of Dexter and had served as its chairman. He is a Colonel on the staff of Governor Hearnes.

He is presently serving as a member of the Executive Board and as Secretary-Treasurer of the Midwest Association of Railroad and Utilities Commissioners.



HOWARD ELLIOTT, JR.

Commissioner

Commissioner Howard Elliott, Jr. was appointed to the Public Service Commission on April 15, 1967, by Governor Warren E. Hearnes, for a six-year term.

Prior to his appointment, Commissioner Elliott was engaged in the private practice of law with the firm of Boyle, Priest, Elliott & Weakley in St. Louis, Missouri. He was active innumerous civic and educational activities there including the Committee of Forty which sponsored and successfully established the St. Louis-St. Louis County Junior College District, which was the first Junior College District established in Missouri.

Commissioner Elliott was born July 4, 1933, and is the youngest Commissioner ever appointed to a full term since the Commission's inception in 1913. He attended Brown University as an undergraduate and is a graduate of the Washington University School of Law. He served in the United States Army from 1956 until 1958.

Commissioner Elliott is a member of the Bar Association of St. Louis, the Cole County Bar, the Missouri Bar, and the American Bar Association. He is a member of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners and the Midwest Association of Railroad and Utilities Commissioners. He is a Republican.



DONAL D. GUFFEY
Commissioner

Donal D. Guffey, a Democrat, was born April 11, 1926, in Kingston, Missouri. He attended public schools there.

He studied civil engineering in undergraduate school, attending Park College and Northwestern University. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from Northwestern in 1947.

Commissioner Guffey served in the United States Navy from 1944 until 1946. He taught in the Mirabile Consolidated High School in 1948.

Mr. Guffey was graduated from the University of Missouri School of Law with an LL. B. degree in 1951.

Commissioner Guffey served as an Assistant Attorney General of Missouri from 1951 until 1960. In 1960, he became engaged in the general practice of law in Kansas City, Missouri, where he was associated with, and a member of the firm of, Hillix, Hall, Hasburgh, Brown and Hoffaus.

He was appointed to the Public Service Commission by Governor John M. Dalton; was sworn in on July 1, 1963. He resigned April 15, 1968 to resume private practice of law. He has since become associate d with the Gas Service Company, Kansas City.



WILLARD C. REINE
Commissioner

Commissioner Willard C. Reine, a Democrat from East Praire, was appointed on April 16, 1968 by Governor Warren E. Hearnes to fill the unexpired term of D. D. Guffey who resigned.

The youngest Commissioner serving the PSC, Commissioner Reine was born in April 19, 1935. He is a graduate of Central Missouri State College at Warrensburg and received his LL. B. from the University of Missouri School of Law in 1960.

Prior to his appointment, Commissioner Reine was Chief Counsel for the Missouri Department of Revenue, previously he had served as Assistant Chief Counsel for Missouri Division of Insurance He served as Assistant Prosecuting Attorney in Mississippi County and City Attorney of East Praire from 1962 until 1965. From 1960 until 1965, he was engaged in the general practice of law in East Praire, Missouri.

Commissioner Reine is a Colonel on Governor Hearnes' Staff. A past president of the State Young Democrats, he later served as National Committeeman for that organization. He is a member of the Committee on Engineering, Depreciation and Valuation of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.



Duties of the Office

- 1) To represent and appear for the Commission in all actions and proceedings involving any question under the Public Service Commission Law or any other law, or under or in reference to any act, order, decision or proceeding of the Commission, and if directed by the Commission, to intervene in any action or proceeding in which any such question is involved.
- 2) To commence and prosecute in the name of the state all actions and proceedings authorized by law and directed or authorized by the Commission;
- 3) When requested, to advise the Commission in regard to all matters in connection with the powers and duties of the Commission: and
- 4) Generally to perform all duties and services as attorney and counsel to the Commission.

In addition to the duties to and on behalf of the Commission, the General Counsel has certain duties to and on behalf of the public.

These duties are as follows:

- 1) To represent the public in all hearings before the Commission; and
- 2) Upon request, give to the public and any municipality advice and opinions as to their rights under the Public Service Commission Law and the legal methods and procedure for obtaining same.

In fulfilling such duties to the Commission and the public, Office of General Counsel during the period of this report appeared before the Commission in 316 cases.

The Office of General Counsel represented the Commission on appeals in seven proceedings in Circuit Court and one each in the Kansas City Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court of Missouri.

## Represents Missourians

The Office of General Counsel also represented the Commission and the public of the state in 25 proceedings before the Interstate Commerce Commission (mostly passenger train discontinuances) and infour \* Later served as Commissioners

proceedings before the Federal Power Commission and the Federal Communications Commission.

In addition, the Office of General Counsel has, in its first year of rendering official opinions to the Commission, the staff and the public, produced 21 opinions. Each of these opinions involved extensive legal research by at least two members of the General Counsel's Office. In order to avoid duplication of such research the opinions have been headnoted, indexed and filed for further reference.

The General Counsel is authorized to employ assistants with the approval of the Governor. During the period of this report the assistants were:

## HEARING EXAMINER'S SECTION

The Public Service Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure provide that when evidence is to be taken in a proceeding before the Commission, any member of the Commission or any Examiner designated by the Commission may preside at the hearing.

The presiding officer shall control the course of hearings, administer oaths, receive evidence, hold appropriate conferences before or during hearings, rule upon all objections or motions which do not involve final determination of proceedings, receive offers of proof, hear argument, and fix time for filing of briefs. He may take

other action as may be necessary and appropriate to the discharge of his duties consistent with the statutory or other authorities under which the Commission functions and with the rules, regulations and policies of the Commission.

Due to the ever increasing workload of cases coming before the Commission resulting from the expansion of utility and transportation industries in Missouri, during the past fiscal year, the Commission established the office of Chief Hearing Examiner.

In addition to the Chief Hearing Examiner, there are four Hearing Examiners

employed by the Commission. One of these five persons is regularly assigned to each of the five Commissioners to assist with the hearings and workload. The Examiners prepare suggested Reports and Orders which are submitted to the Commission for consideration, editing and final decision. In addition, the Chief Hearing Examiner is responsible for work assignments and schedules for informal matters.

In addition to the Hearing Examiners assigned to the Chief Hearing Examiner,

there is a Reporter of Opinions who is responsible for analyzing all Reports and Orders and preparing headnotes for each case published in the Public Service Commission Reports and advance sheet service which supplements this publication. It is also the duty of the Reporter of Opinions to prepare an appropriate index for all principles of law and legal rulings involved in the published Reports. The Reporter of Opinions combines with the newly created position of the Legal Proofreader in editing and proofing Reports and Orders suggested by the Chief Hearing Examiner or Hearing Examiners before they go to the Commission for consideration.

The Chief Hearing Examiner and the four Hearing Examiners and Reporter of Opinions are all attorneys, three of whom are associate Joint Board members of the Interstate Commerce Commission who as such, from time to time, represent Missouri by hearing Joint Board cases for the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The necessary stenographic work for the Chief Hearing Examiner and for Hearing Examiners and Reporter of Opinions is performed by three Legal Secretaries.

## REPORTING SECTION

With the establishment of the office of Chief Hearing Examiner, the Reporting Department, which is responsible for the preparation of all transcripts of hearings, is assigned to the Chief Hearing Examiner. During the period covered by this report, July 1, 1967, to June 30, 1968, the Reporting Department reported 354 cases. There were 44 cases not requiring transcripts. A total of 29, 249 master pages were transcribed by this department and 27, 251 pages of transcript were sold. A total of 938 hours were spent in the hearing room by personnel of this department.

## THE SECRETARY

## Office

## of the Secretary

The Public Service Commission Act provides that the Commission appoint a Secretary to have general charge of its office, supervise its cherical business and "perform such other duties as the Commission may prescribe." Sam L. Manley is the Commission Secretary.

With the widening scope of regulation following the enactment of the Commission law, the duties of its Secretary have grown into a department of administrative responsibility.

## Keeps a True Record

In addition to the early supervisory matters the Act set forth for the Secretary, he is charged with the obligation to keep a true and complete record of all Commission proceedings. He sets the date for hearings, receives and processes applications filed by the industries the Commission regulates and informs parties of interest of the final decisions of the Commission, its notifications, motions and so forth.

Infulfilling his responsibilities to the Commission, it is the duty of the Secretary to keep a true and complete record of all Commission proceedings. Records are filed in their original form for five years. After that five - year period, the records are transferred to microfilm for permanent storage.

The permanent records and case papers of the Commission are open to the interested public at any time during office hours. Records go back to April 25, 1913

when "Case Number One" was concluded and became a matter of history.

The Secretary has two assistants in addition to his staff of personnel to help in handling this administrative department. The Assistant Secretary is responsible for processing all transportation applications and to assist attorneys, the staff and the interested public seeking information from Commission records. Another assitant processes all utility applications and makes available public records pertaining to utility records.

## Correspondence Is Heavy

The Commission has a heavy daily flow of mail. All mail directed to this regulatory agency of state government is received by the Office of Secretary. This mail, with the exception of personal mail, is opened by the staff and distributed to the proper Office for action. Most correspondence from the Commission is signed by the Secretary.

The present Secretary acts as personnel manager for the Commission. Most

employee interviews are handled first by the Secretary and applications for employment are completed under his supervision. Several aptitude and technical skill tests have been adopted for use by the Secretary. The results of these tests are evaluated by him. In the Office of the Secretary, a complete file of personnel records is maintained.

The Secretary is keeper of the official Commission Seal. He is authorized to affix this seal to Commission documents. With the responsibility of the seal goes the authority to administer the Oath of Office to Commission employees.

Public relations and public information is within the scope of responsibility of the Secretary. A public information section is responsible for keeping the public informed through the various news media of Commission activities. Regular mailings of news releases are sent, at the direction of the Commission, to newspapers, television and radio stations in Missouri and those publications interested in the industries under Commission jurisdiction.

## Advance Sheet Service

In 1965, the Commission instituted an Advance Sheet Service to supplement its regular publication of certain selected

decisions of the Commission in bound-volume form. The Commission is required by law to publish "Public Service Commission Reports" which is the reproduction of its selected decisions. There had been a gap of several months to more than a year between publications of these volumes. To implement the publication, a monthly Advance Sheet service was begun. Cases printed in the monthly editions are found in later bound volumes as they are published.

The Reporter of Opinions headnotes cases for the Advance Sheet and prepares a digest of the cases selected for that month. Advance Sheets are then printed at the Commission in looseleaf form. The Public Information section does a brief resume of cases in a wrap-up sheet.

The Advance Sheet service is supplied to 156 subscribers at a fee of \$15 annually. Most of its subscribers are attorneys and executives of companies whose operations are under Commission jurisdiction.

The Commission issued Volume 12, "Public Service Commission Reports", during the period of this annual report. The processing of requests for this publication and the mailing of the volumes to subscribers was handled by the Public Information section.

Operates Print Shop

The Commission has its own print shop which is also under the direction of the Secretary. The vast amount of printed matter used by the Commission in forms, charts and so forth are printed there. Commission letterhead, all the reports, orders, writs, notices and other official documents are printed there.

Each Friday, the Secretary's staff prepares and sends to the print shop the schedule of hearings on cases before the Commission the following week. The number and nature of the case, hearing examiner, time and other pertinent information is listed on this weekly docket.

A monthly register of cases pertaining to the regulation of bus and truck matters is printed and mailed to the trucking industry by the Office of the Secretary. This publication is available at a fee of \$12 per year as another information service.

Formal hearings before the Commission require a transcript of testimony for the record upon which a decision is based. Transcripts, which are a court reporters' verbatim accounting of the hearing, are reproduced, printed and bound by the print shop.

During the fiscal year reported, the public information section prepared two listings of the authorized truck and bus companies operating in Missouri. The listings, which will be kept current by the Office of Transportation, were offered the motor carrier industry at a fee of \$5 per year for each listing. One is alphabetical by name of company and the other is alphabetical by county where the company is based. A total of 163 subscribers have asked for this information service.

All reports and orders, orders, supplemental orders, special writs and other documents pertaining to Commission matters are printed in the Office of the Secretary,

During the fiscal year covered by this report, the Commission issued 5,263 reports and orders on its utility and transportation decisions. That figure does not include the numerous suspension and reinstatement orders from the Office of Transportation. It does not include the notices of hearings, changes of dates for hearings, writs, supplemental orders permits, acknowlegments, and so forth, processed by the Commission through its

As noted earlier in this accounting, the Secretary has two assistants to aid in handling of applications filed by transportation and utility companies under Commission jurisdiction. These applications include Commission approval for new authority to operate, permission to amend operating procedures, extending of areas of service, curtailment of services or cut-


ting out of certain areas of service, changes of rates for services and numerous other matters. Motions of protest, motions to intervene, continuance requests and the filings of briefs on cases are other matters handled by the Secretary's assistants.

During the past fiscal year, a total of 1,311 applications were processed by the Secretary's staff. The Commission heard 836 cases.

In addition to his other duties, the Secretary acts as property manager for the Commission. He must maintain a complete inventory of Commission properties and is responsible for the purchase of new supplies and equipment for all divisions of the Commission.



# TRANSPORTATION

# **Transportation**

Missouri law provides for certain regulatory controls over transportation operations in this State. It is the duty of the Public Service Commission to fulfill those regulatory obligations in matters concerned with bus, truck and railroad transportation services.

Most transportation related activities of the Commission are the immediate responsibility of the Office of Transportation. The Director of Transportation is responsible to the Commission for all matters concerned with the regulation of motor carriers and for rates and services of railroad companies. Other railroad matters under Commission jurisdiction (such as safety regulations) are handled through the Office of Utilities.

During the period of this annual report, George Fox has served the Commission as Director of Transportation. Mr. Fox was named Director with the reorganization program of the Commission which began in 1966.

Included in the scope of duties of the Office of Transportation are:

Enforcement of Missouri Bus & Truck Law and the rules and regulations of the Commission:

The annual sale of motor carrier license stickers:

Maintenance of insurance records: Tariffs and time schedules:

Rates and services of all transportation agencies subject to Commission jurisdiction.

These respective areas of responsibility are assigned to an appropriate section under a Section Chief. The Section Chief reports to the Director of Transportation, who is responsible to the Commission for the actions and work assignments within the various sections.

The principal duties and obligations of each section, as well as a description of a number of projects and completed programs occurring during the period of this report will be found in the following resume of the activities of the Office of Transportation.

# Organizational Changes

A major revision of the Office of Transportation occurred during the period covered by this accounting of Commission activities.

On May 10, 1968, Henry O. Reinhardt, Chief Rate Expert, retired after more than 20 years with the Commission. Duties previously assigned to the Rates and Services Section, under Mr. Reinhardt's supervision,

were divided into two departments: the Rates and Services Section and the Operating Rights Section.

# OPERATING RIGHTS SECTION

The Section of Operating Rights was created to more efficiently and expeditiously handle matters related to motor carrier authorities. Ray N. Allmon was promoted to Chief of this section.

This section is charged with the duty and responsibility of maintaining comprehensive records concerning the operating authorities of every intrastate motor carrier authorized to conduct intrastate transporation services with the State of Missouri. The section must also maintain records of permits issued to carriers engaged exclusively in interstate commerce on Missouri highways.

#### Records Are Essential

The maintenance of these records is essential to the successful administration of economic transportation regulation. Through these records the Commission can ascertain when an immediate and urgent need for motor carrier service merits the issuance of temporary authority—a "rush" certification in the public interest. The initial recommendation to grant or extend a temporary motor carrier authority comes to the attention of the Commission from this section.

Since the creation of this section early this fiscal year, 163 orders recommending the disposal of temporary authority applications were issued.

The Operating Rights Section examined 127 applications for transfer of authorities involving certificated carriers. In each instance, a statement of the operating rights involved in the case was outlined in detail. This service expedites

the issuing of a PSC order, assures the correct restatement of the operating rights for the transferor and protects the stability of the transportation industry.

Applications for new or additional authority are examined by the Operating Rights Section. After examination and investigation, an appropriate description of the authority sought is prepared. This description is published in the monthly Truck Notice Register issued by the Secretary's Office.

During the period of this report, 113 such statements of authority were prepared for publication.

Personnel from this section assist the Commission's legal staff and its hearing examiners by reviewing each proposed Commission order concerned with the granting of new or additional intrastate authority. This effort is in the interest of uniformity of the statement of operating rights and to eliminate ambiguity.

# RATES & SERVICES SECTION

The Rates and Services Section is headed by Robert F. Hencey who was promoted to the position of Chief following the reorganization of the department.

The responsibility for assisting and advising the Commission in its administration of the task of governing rates and services of railroads, street railways, express and pullman car companies and freight and passenger motor carriers is assigned to this Section.

Under the Missouri statutes, all carriers must publish, post and file with the Commission a schedule of rates, fares and charges applicable to the services which they perform. These publications must be examined by personnel of the Rates Section to determine whether or not the schedule conforms to the scope of authority in the case of motor carriers, whether there is reasonable compliance with the tariff rules and regulations and to otherwise determine the reasonableness of any proposed changes in the published rates. When it is the opinion of the Section personnel that the public interest may be adversely affected, recommendation is made to the Commission that the changes be suspended for investigation and that the matter be assigned for hearing.

All inquiries and informal complaints concerning closing of stations, discontinuance of train service or other changes in freight or passenger train services are first referred to this Section. Most of these inquiries and informal complaints can be handled informally, but some require extensive investigation and result in formal proceedings before the Commission or by the Interstate Commerce Commission. This Section endeavors to keep informed as to transportation conditions throughout the nation and maintains extensive files of interstate rail and motor carrier tariffs and statistical data from other State Commissions, the Interstate Commerce Commission and various transportation agencies. Inquires are frequently referred to this Section from other divisions of the State and the tariffs and statistical data available in this Section are invaluable in providing needed information.

This Section also is responsible to receive, examine and maintain the file of motor carrier annual and quarterly reports. Data reflecting the economic and financial conditions in the motor carrier industry are compiled from the carrier's annual reports and have been maintained by this Section for several years.

By Report and Order dated January 16, 1968, effective January 26, 1968, in Case T-25, 712, motor carriers were required to establish effective February 1, 1968, increased minimum charges and increased class rates. These increases were to supersede and cancel emergency surcharges theretofore prescribed by the Commission's Interim Report and Order entered in this Case on July 27, 1967.

These freight rate increases were authorized after full hearing before the Commission for the purpose of offsetting increased costs of operation and to permit a more equitable return based upon unsatisfactory operating results for prior years. The increases amounted to approximately 15% for less-truckload class rates and 4% for truckload class rates and were estimated to produce an average increase in Missouri intrastate revenues for such carriers of 11. 9%.

Although the full measure of increases in rates and charges authorized by the

Interstate Commerce Commission for the nation's railroads were in effect in Missouri for this year, such increases were made the subject of an investigation proceedings as to the reasonableness of such increased freight rates and charges and by Order dated June 25, 1968 in Case No. 16, 336, the Commission has set the matter for public hearing on September 25, 1968, and notice has been sent to all known interested parties.

## Investigate Tariffs

During the past fiscal year, the Rates and Services Section received and examined more than 8,900 common carrier tariff schedules. Missouri railroads and their tariff agents filed 5,421 freight rate schedules and 446 passenger fare tariffs. The Railway Express Agency filed a total of 47 express rate schedules. Motor carriers of property filed a total of 5,421 tariffs or supplements containing rate changes and motor common carriers of passengers

filed 494 fare schedules. Each of these schedules was examined to determine if it conformed to the statutory notice requirement of 30 days and whether or not the changes made therein were in accordance with the rules of publication and whether the changes were just and reasonable. During the year, only eight tariff schedules had to be rejected because of failure to give statutory notice or for flagrant departure from the tariff publishing rules.

#### Buses Change Schedules

Motor bus operators that operate on regular routes are required to publish and file with the Commission time schedules showing the arrival and departure time at each point authorized to be served. It is also necessary that these schedules be examined to determine what changes are being made and whether or not such changes may adversely affect the public. During the year, 90 new bus time schedules were received and examined. Changes that are proposed in such time schedules are called to the attention of the officials in the affected communities and otherwise publicized in order that any opposition to the proposed schedule changes may be brought to the attention of the Commission and so that the Commission can determine whether or not a hearing is desirable. Whenever substantial protest is made, it is the policy to suspend the proposed change pending determination of the propriety of the proposed change. Oftentimes, however, when the carriers are advised of protest or opposition to the changes, they will withdraw or offer alternate proposals to satisfy the protestants without the necessity for formal proceedings.

By statute, carriers are required to give the Commission and public 30 days notice when effecting changes in rates and fares. By Commission rule, at least 15 days notice is required for effecting changes in time schedules. However, the Commission may, for good cause, allow such changes on shorter notice or permit departure from tariff making rules. During the past year, the Section received, considered and disposed of 141 applications for special authority to depart from the tariff circular requirements or to make changes on short notice.

Contract carriers operating under permits issued by the Commission are required to file a copy of their contract with each shipper. Each new or amended contract is examined by the Rates Section to determine whether the rates, charges and other provisions are reasonable and proper and that the contract otherwise conforms to the authorization of the carrier.


#### Must File Charges

Railroads and motor carriers are required to file with each new tariff schedule a statement of the changes being made in their rates and charges and the reasons therefor. When, in the opinion of the Section, any change in rate or other tariff provision would seem to adversely affect the public interest, a recommendation is made to the Commission that the new tariff schedule be suspended and an investigation instituted so that determination can be made as to the reasonableness and propriety of the proposed rates or charges. During the past year, 18 recommended orders instituting or disposing of investigation and suspension cases were prepared in this Section for consideration by the Commission.

# Intercity Bus Fares

Most Missouri motor carriers of passengers filed tariff schedules to increase fares 5% July 1, 1967. These tariffs

were suspended and the matter was assigned Case B-25, 793. The Commission after completing its investigation authorized some small and medium sized carriers to increase fares, but found that the major



carriers did not prove the need for additional revenues and required them to cancel suspended tariffs. All carriers increased express rates May 1, 1968. During this period charter rates of most carriers were increased slightly in an attempt to offset rising costs of operation. Trenton-St. Joseph Coaches, after suffering a financial loss in the operation due to the lack of patronage, requested the Commission to cancel its certificate between Monroe City and Kansas City, however, Missouri Transit Lines, based at Moberly, applied for and received authority to serve between Moberly and Kansas City and very few patrons were left without service. Greyhound continued its nonstop service between St. Louis and Kansas City and reduced the operating time from four hours and fifteen minutes to three hours fifty-nine minutes. Greyhound in April 1968 inaugurated direct service to Fort Leonard Wood on several mission to convert its operation throughout regular buses operating between St. Louis and Joplin, providing improved service to military personnel by eliminating the transfer formerly made at Waynesville.

A slight decline occurred in the earnings of the major carriers whose costs are mounting faster than revenues.

In comparing statistics of 9 major carriers during the years 1965 and 1967 when no large Missouri carrier was hamperedby a strike, it is noted that since 1965. the year of the last general increase in intrastate passenger fares, the carriers have operated 190,928 fewer regular route miles and have transported 1, 585, 686 fewer regular route passengers, but have increased regular route revenues \$7,015,476. Revenues from charter and express have increased steadily in recent years but the combined revenues from all sources have failed to equal increased expenses caused primarily by increased labor costs.

#### Passenger Train Service

The downward trend in passenger train service continued during the past year. The St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company was authorized to discontinue its two remaining passenger trains in Missouri and the Missouri Pacific applied to discontinue its remaining service between St. Louis and Kansas City. The Commission authorized the Norfolk and Western Railway to discontinue Trains 203 and 212 between St. Louis and Kansas City.

Due to increased operating costs, Railway Express Agency, commonly referred to as REA, was allowed to increase its commodity and class rates. Effective April 1, 1968, REA converted its operations almost entirely to trucks. The change was made following an emergency grant of authority from the Interstate Commerce Comthe country to a so-called "Hub Plan". REA's application for corresponding temporary intrastate operating rights was set for public hearing July 9, 1968, and the company placed an embargo on intrastate express shipments to numerous points in Missouri pending decision on its application for motor carrier authority.

Total railroad mileage of Class 1 railroads was increased somewhat during the past year due to the completion of new tracks by the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway into the newly developed mining area near Bixby, Missouri. There were no major abandonments, although some of the lines reported slight mileage reductions. The mileage for small railroads was reduced by 3.48 miles from that reported a

year ago due to the acquisition of the Missouri and Illinois Bridge and Belt Railroad Company by the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad Company effective near the end of last year.

The following table shows the track mileage in Missouri operated by the various railroads as of December 31, 1967.

# **ENFORCEMENT SECTION**

The Enforcement Section of the Office of Transportation was created to combat illegal transportation of goods and passengers in commercial vehicles and to promote safety on Missouri highways.

A staff of field investigators, headed by J. Sidney Schanbacher, Chief Enforcement Officer, is responsible for attaining the goals of the Commission regarding enforcement of motor carrier rules and regulation. Since Enforcement Officers have no power of arrest, a close liaison between the Commission staff and the Missouri State Highway Patrol is maintained. It is the responsibility of the Patrol to make arrests for violations of Commission law, rules and regulations.

Ten field investigators made up the field investigators staff of the Enforcement Section during the period of this report. Those field men are continually active throughout their assigned territories within the State striving to eliminate illegal shipping and make Missouri highways safe. These investigators check equipment on the roads of Missouri and at weight stations along State highways. In fulfilling their daily duties, they strengthen the goals of

the Commission, the Governor's Coordinating Committee for Traffic Safety and cooperate with requirements of the Federal Highway Safety Act of 1966.

From July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1968, the staff of enforcement officers drove a total of 213, 735 miles in the performance of their official duties. They made a total of 1, 828 contacts with certificated motor carriers and checked 1, 620 trucks. In addition to 411 investigation assignments, they investigated 21 serious accidents involving certificated carriers.

# Training of Investigators

Field investigators are trained for the task of enforcing Missouri's laws, rules and regulations. All are graduates of national training seminars which include both economic and safety regulation instruction.

Missouri's enforcement officers have attended safety training seminars conducted by the Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, Bureau of Motor Carrier Safety and are well-qualified to make rigid safety inspections of motor equipment to assure its safe operation condition.

#### Missouri Holds First Seminar

The Missouri Commission, some three years ago, held the pilot program for officers. Following that initial school in Missouri, six regional economic training seminars and two regional safety seminars have been held. These eight seminars were sponsored by the National Conference of State Transportation Specialists. Members of Missouri's Commission and all members of the enforcement section have completed these training seminars. Both Mr. Fox, the Director of the Office of Transportation, and Mr. Schanbacher,

Chief Enforcement Officer, have participated in these seminars as instructors.

At the writing of this report, the rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission Bus & Truck law are being revised to more closely conform with those rules and regulations of other state commissions and the federal regulatory agencies.

#### Sign Cooperative Agreements

This revision was necessary following Missouri's participation in two cooperative agreements, one with the Interstate Commerce Commission and another with the Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration. (The official signing of this agreement was issued on September 17, 1968, but the PSC order concerning the agreement was issued on April 30, 1968).

The cooperative agreement with the Interstate Commerce Commission was entered into by Missouri in February of 1967 in compliance with Public Law 89-170. That law promotes uniformity in regulation of motor carriers throughout the United States.


One safety regulation which was originated by the Interstate Commerce Commission is an "Out-of-Service" program. This program provides that any motor carrier vehicle which is found to be unsafe to operate is declared "out-of-service" by enforcement officers. That unit will not be allowed to operate until the necessary repairs to saidvehicles are made. Defective steering, brakes, lighting and tires are the principal items checked in safety inspections by enforcement officers in the field.

Another provision of the cooperative agreements is the interchange of information by federal enforcement officers and

investigators with state personnel enforcing economic and safety regulations for motor carriers.

The two joint agreements have been the outgrowth of numerous conferences with various state transportation officials; regulatory commissioners; the Department of Transportation and the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Uniformity of requirements across the nation plus the exchange of information for purposes of strengthening enforcement will result in the elimination of many "gray" areas in the commercial transportation field. It will help prevent a carrier from inadvertently operating his vehicles inviolation and keep him aware of the purpose of economic regulation which protects the carrier, shipper and the public.



# Leasing Agreements

Often leasing agreements have been found to be subterfuge to avoid PSC regulation at the expense of the motor carrier industry and the public. These situations are often discovered by field investigators

on routine visits at the offices of carriers in their areas.

#### Monthly Patrol Letter

The Commission keeps the Highway Patrol informed of those certificated carriers found in violation of some PSC requirement. The PSC also furnishes the Patrol with a monthly "Patrol Letter" which lists new authorities and changes or transfers of old authorities.

The Highway Patrol supplies the Commission with copies of its "violation reports" involving commercial motor vehicles. These reports are forwarded to the Enforcement Section for review. The field investigator then receives copies of violations which have occurred in his territory. The Interstate Commerce Commission and the Department of Transportation are sent copies of these reports when interstate interest arises. If the carrier involved is from another state, that state receives a copy of the reported violation from the PSC staff.

Rigid enforcement of PSC regulatory requirements with the cooperation of the Patrol is cutting down illegal, unsafe commercial traffic on our highways.

# INSURANCE SECTION

Missouri statutes require that motor carriers operating vehicles on Missouri highways file evidence of insurance for the protection of the public. The Insurance Section of the Office of Transportation is responsible for handling all matters pertaining to the fulfillment of these requirements. Miss Marguerite Smith is the Chief Insurance Clerk.

Bodily injury, liability and property damage insurance must be carried by all motor carriers operating on Missourihighways and in addition, common carriers authorized to engage in intrastate commerce must file with the Commission evidence of cargo damage insurance. Under special circumstances, the Commission may waive the requirement of cargo insurance. This is normally done only if the cargo is of relatively low value. By agreement of the shippers involved, cargo insurance coverage may be waived for contract carriers.

Upon demonstrating sufficient financial qualifications as deemed necessary by the Commission, a motor carrier may be authorized to act as a self-insurer. It is the responsibility of the Insurance Section to see that an appropriate certificate of insurance is received for each new carrier granted operating rights and that appropriate insurance is maintained by all carriers.

#### To Protect the Public

As a matter of public protection, the Commission requires that insurance companies must give at least 30 days' notice of cancellation of insurance. Upon receipt of any such notice of cancellation, the Insurance Section notifies the carrier whose policy has been cancelled approximately

30 days in advance that notice of its insurance cancellation has been received and that unless evidence of appropriate coverage is received on or before the effective date of such cancellation, that its operating rights will be suspended.

# Subject to Suspension

If evidence of insurance is not received prior to the date of cancellation, the carrier's right to operate on Missouri highways is suspended. If a new insurance certificate is not filed within a reasonable period, usually about six months, an order is issued directing the carrier to show cause why its operating authority should not be revoked for failure to maintain evidence of insurance. The Insurance Section also sends semiannually reminders to those carriers which have been authorized to be self-insurers to submit current financial statements evidencing qualifications as self-insurers.

In most instances carriers that are advised of their insurance cancellation promptly arrange for new coverage. Out of 2, 700 cancellation notices sent out by the Insurance Section in the past year, appropriate insurance was filed prior to cancellation in 1,532 instances, but the operating rights of 1, 168 carriers were suspended in the year, 784 carriers had been reinstated by the end of the fiscal year.

If, after having been suspended for six months or so, a carrier has not filed a certificate on insurance in accordance with the Commission requirements, an order is issued directing it to "show cause" why its authority should not be revoked for failure to maintain insurance. During the past year, as a result of such proceeding, the operating rights of 651 carriers were revoked for failing to maintain evidence of insurance.



To insure that appropriate coverage is provided, each certificate is carefully examined by the Insurance Section to make sure that the name and address on the insurance certificate corresponds to that on the permit held by such carriers. Needless to say, with the hundreds of insurance companies involved and the thousands of carriers involved, it is necessary to return many of the certificates for correction. During the year, however, a total of 4,052 such certificates were received, approved and filed.

Occasionally, in order to enable the institution of motor carrier operations with a minimum of delay, telegram binders from the insurance company are accepted as temporary coverage for periods up to 30 days pending receipt of an appropriate insurance certificate.

### LICENSE & RECORDS SECTION

The License and Records Section, headed by Mrs. Judith Kolb, Chief License Clerk, is responsible for the issuance of annual license stickers. This section must also handle the replacement of mutilated, damaged or worn license stickers as outlined in the rules of the Commission.

An annual license sticker is required on all motor carrier vehicles operating under certificates or permits issued by this Commission. The exception to this rule is such vehicles which are operated by residents of states with which this Commission has a reciprocal agreement. Reciprocity agreements with 27 states were in effect during the period of this report.

During the year of this report, a total of \$863, 573 was collected from PSC license fees. That figure is an increase of 6.1% over the \$813, 942 collected the previous fiscal year.

The instigation of telegraphic authority in advance of the issuance of PSC stickers was a new service of this section this year. The motor carrier could telephone the Commission, advise the License Section of his need for license sticker and telegraph the fee to the Commission. In return, a telegram stating that the fee had been received and sticker on its way affords the carrier authority to move his equipment prior to the actual receipt of the sticker.

The fees collected by the License Section is transmitted to the Department of



# UTILITIES

# **UTILITIES**

The Office of Utilities was established with the 1966 reorganization of the Commission. The purpose was to better coordinate the activities of personnel involved in the procedures of utility regulation and railroad safety matters. F. D. Hequembourg, a former Commission engineer, is the Director of the Office of Utilities.

It is the duty of the Director to act as an intermediary official of the Commission. He is directly responsible to the Commission for the actions of personnel in all sections of this Office.

#### Engineering & Accounting

The Office of Utilities is divided into two distinct departmental divisions: the Accounting Department and the Engineering Department. The Chief Accountant heads the Accounting Department and the Engineering Department is headed by the Chief Engineer. Both are responsible to the Director of Utilities.

The Accounting and Engineering Departments' responsibilities are outlined in the opening paragraphs of the reports from those respective divisions in this section of the annual report. A detailed accounting of the activities of each department is included.

It is the direct responsibility of the Director of Utilities to coordinate the programs and projects of the Engineering and Accounting Departments and to report to the Commission any recommendations which result from investigations, studies and audits made by the staff of these departments.

It is the duty of the Director of Utilities to assign investigations into any facet of public utility operation under Commission jurisdiction. He can call for the inventory of all physical properties used and useful in public utility service when such a study is deemed necessary by the Commission. He calls for the examination of the financial structure of a utility or an audit of its books when the information is useful to the Commissions decision.

# Staff of Experts

The Public Service Commission uses the staff of experts from the Office of Utilities to fulfill its regulatory obligations involved in utility matters. Through this Office, the Commission is kept advised of such matters as the economic feasibility of service extensions or plant expansions proposed by a utility company. It is the staff from this Office that outlines depreciation reserve recommendations. Rate of return is determined by this staff; security issues are evaluated and original cost studies are made, to list a few of the numerous responsibilities of the Office.

These reports are available for public inspection. The information contained therein is used extensively by security holders and investment brokers, municipal and county officials, plus any other interested persons.

The department comprehensively reviews each Annual Report. Where problem areas are noted, the staff communicates with the company to ascertain additional information for clarification, thus attempting to perfect the report and make it more useful to its readers.

During the review of the Annual Reports the staff notes the utilities needing additional Commission assistance, and areas in which the utilities are having difficulties in completing their Annual Reports. As a result, the staff assists the

utilities in correcting the various errors and informs them as to the proper steps to be taken to accurately complete the Annual Reports. The assistance is accomplished either by correspondence or, in the more serious cases, by an actual field visit by the staff.

#### Audits & Examinations

The personnel of the department perform their duties regarding audits and examinations both in the office and in the field. The purpose of these audits is to determine the original cost of the property used and useful in public service and the financial condition of the utilities. The department also furnishes accounting guidance and assistance to the utilities. This data developed is utilized by the Commission in the cases coming before it and in

the excercise of its policy of continuing surveillance.

During the field work in the fiscal year 1967-68 numerous deviations were noted and exceptions were taken to the accounting distribution of specific items recorded in the books of the companies. These deviations and exceptions in most cases necessitated adjustments to the accounts.

#### Utility Assessments

The Commission is one of the few self-supporting governmental agencies and collects the revenues with which it conducts its varied operations from the entire group of regulated utilities. The Commission is directed annually to assess each utility in accordance with the provisions of Section 386.370 R.S. Mo., 1967 Supp., effective June 1, 1967.

Subsequent to that directive the Commission, on June 28, 1968, entered its Order in Case No. 11,110, Supplemental Order No. 22, in which it estimated the amount of its expenses for the fiscal year 1968-69 at \$1,260,357.

At the conclusion of this fiscal year there remained in the Public Service Commission Fund \$441,804, which has not been expended by the Commission for various The principal cause being that reasons. recruiting of professional employees could not be initiated unless and until needed funds were appropriated and such positions could not be filled until qualified personnel were secured. This money is ratably deducted from the current year's estimated expenditures, and the utilities are subsequently assessed a sufficient amount to conduct the operations of the Commission for the ensuing fiscal year; hence, the Commission will need \$818,553 (\$1,260,357-\$441,804).

#### 1968-1969 Assessments

For the fiscal year 1968-69 the Commission assessed the various groups of utilities as follows:

(A) Railroad Companies	\$ 80,000
(B) Street Railroad Corp.	2,400
(C) Other Common Carriers	1,600
(D) Electric, Gas, Water Heating, Telephone and Sewer Companies	732,553
(E) Telegraph Corp.	2,000

The cost accounting section of the department allocates the assessments to various utilities, using as its base the prior year's gross revenues. Subsequent to the computation of the individual current year's assessments, these are presented to the Commission for approval. The department then prepares and mails the assessments.

#### Authority Fees

Authority fees are assessed to the utility subsequent to the issuance of the Commission's Report and Order authorizing the utility to issue its capital securities.

During the fiscal year utility authority and miscellaneous fees of \$119,027 and \$8,945, respectively, were collected. The collection of these fees, totaling \$127,972 in the fiscal year 1967-68 represents an increase of 36.8% and 40% over that of the fiscal years of 1966-67 and 1965-66.

All authority and miscellaneous fees are credited directly to the State General Revenue Fund.

Current practices of the department are to employ only professional Accountants who have obtained a college degree. There are a few individuals in the department who have not as yet obtained a college degree. They are currently attending night school at a recognized university in an endeavor to obtain a college degree, and their experience in the field of regulations is such that they are valued members of our staff.

All members of the staff have been urged to continue their education by reading current periodicals, technical bulletins, etc., and, if they desire, to continue their college education in an endeavor to obtain the next higher degree.

During the fiscal year the Commission has maintained close contact and cooperated with Federal and other State regulatory agencies in connection with joint problems relative to the Missouri investorowned utilities.

The department is constantly being called upon for assistance and information by those regulated, as well as the general public, and, when not in conflict with Commission policy, such assistance and information are furnished. The department works in close cooperation with other departments within the Commission, and many of the results a chieved have been through the cooperation and assistance from these other departments.

#### ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

The Engineering Department of the Office of Utilities is headed by Richard A. Keiselbach, Chief Engineer. A staff of engineers and technicians trained and experienced in specialized fields are required to fulfill the responsibilities of this department. A number of the staff are registered professional engineers.

The Engineering Department is responsible for the review of tariffs filed by electric, gas, steam heating, telegraph, telephone, water and sewer utilities operating in Missouri under the jurisdiction of the Commission. This department makes original cost appraisals and related studies of the physical properties of regulated utilities. It determines and recommends depreciation accrual rates and makes depreciation reserve requirement studies to determine if the depreciation reserve recorded by a utility is adequate. It also investigates matters concerned with railroad safety and studies proposed construction and safety installations at intersections of road and rail.

During the period of this report, the Engineering Department completed five telephone and one gas depreciation studies. Commission Orders were written based upon depreciation accrual rate studies made by the engineering staff. Eight depreciation reserve studies were made to determine if a utility's recorded depreciation reserve was adequate at the same time original cost studies were completed.

The Engineering Department this fiscal year, completed eight original cost studies. Included were five water company studies and three sewer studies. These original cost appraisals were made to determine original cost of the utiltiy plant "used and useful" in the rendering of ser-

vice to the public. Original cost studies are vital to the determination of the proper rate base for a utility.

At the writing of this annual report, engineers are engaged in making trended original cost studies of three large water utility companies which have filed for increased rates. Commission engineers will be required to testify before the Commission at hearings on these cases.

The staff of the Engineering Department devotes a considerable amount of its time to informal conferences with officials and representatives of utility and railroad companies. These conferences are necessary in order that many of the problems confronting companies under Commission regulation be solved without formal proceedings.


The Department is responsible for reviewing Session Orders and Reports and Orders of the Commission which pertain to utility or railroad cases. Often the staff

prepares the rough drafts of such orders for the Commission.

Another responsibility of the Engineering Department is the processing of customers complaints. The department answers, investigates and files each inquiry and complaint received from utility customers concerning service, rates and so forth.



#### Numerous Complaints

During the period of this report, the department wrote approximately 2, 100 letters in reply to complaints, service requests, tariffs, railroad safety, inadequate service, accounting or billing disputes, depreciation rates, original cost studies and numerous other miscellaneous subjects. Many of the complaints or disputes are resolved by personnel of the Engineering Department through communications with company and customer. Some complaints require field investigation by department personnel. Other complaints have resulted in hearings before the Commission for final resolution. The staff is usually called upon to provide expert testimony at such hearings.

Engineers of the department are called upon to investigate any natural or mechanical phenomenon which cause major service disruptions in utility or railroad operations. Electrical power outages, gas explosions, accidents and so forth are exemplary of such emergency investigations. A report is made to the Commission following these investigations.

# For Safe Operations

During the past year, staff engineers assisted the Commission in the formulation and adoption of orders and directives which will promote the safe operation of various utilities in Missouri.

Several members of the department serve on the Governor's Emergency Resources Management Plan as key operating officials. This plan was established for the event of a nuclear attack or natural disaster.

As this report is being written, the 90th Congress, in its 2nd Session, has passed an Act known as the "Natural Gas

Pipeline Safety Act of 1968", and it is expected that the President of the United States will sign the Act at an early date.

# The Gas Safety Act

Section 3(a) of the Act provides that as soon as practicable, but not later than three months after the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall, by order, adopt as interim minimum Federal safety standards for pipeline facilities and the transportation of gas in each state the state standards regulating pipeline facilities and the transportation of gas within such State on the date of enactment of this Act. In any state in which no such standards are in effect, the Secretary shall, by order, establish interim Federal safety standards for pipeline facilities and the transportation of gas in such state which shall be such standards as are common to a majority of states having safety standards for the transportation of gas and pipeline facilities on such date. Interim standards shall remain in

effect until amended or revoked pursuant to this section. Any state agency may adopt such additional or more stringent standards for pipeline facilities and the transportation of gas not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Power Commission under the Natural Gas Act as are not incompatible with the Federal minimum standards, but may not adopt or continue in force after the interim standards provided for above become effective any such standards applicable to interstate transmission facilities.

# Program of Gas Safety

Section 3(b) of the Act provides that not later than twenty-four months after the enactment of this Act, and from time to time thereafter, the Secretary shall, by order, establish minimum Federal safety standards for the transportation of gas and pipeline facilities. Such standards may apply to the design, installation, inspection, testing, construction, extension, operation, replacement, and maintenance of pipeline facilities. Standards affecting the design, installation, construction, initial inspection, and initial testing shall not be applicable to pipeline facilities in existence on the date such standards are adopted. Whenever the Secretary shall find a particular facility to be hazardous to life or property, he shall be empowered to require the person operating such facility to take such steps necessary to remove such hazards.

With certain exceptions the provisions of the Act shall not apply to pipeline facilities and the transportation of gas (not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Power Commission under the Natural Gas Act) within a state when the safety standards and practices applicable to same are regulated by a state agency (including a municipality) which submits to the Secretary an annual certification that such agency

(1) has regulatory jurisdiction over the safety standards and practices of such pipeline facilities and transportation of gas; (2) has adopted each Federal safety standard applicable to such pipeline facilities and transportation of gas established under this Act as of the date of the certification; (3) is enforcing each such standard; and (4) has the authority to require record maintenance, reporting, inspection substantially the same as are provided under section 12 of the Act and filing for approval of plans of inspection and maintenance described in section 11 of the Act.

# Missouri's Requirements

The Missouri Public Service Commission has adopted standards and has commenced a program which should enable it to retain jurisdiction over the safety aspects of gas utilities under its jurisdiction. This program must be accelerated in order to retain jurisdiction on a state level.


The American Society of Mechanical Engineers has designated the Chief Engineer of the Commission as a Member of the ASME Conference Group, which will make it possible for a representative of the Commission to participate in meetings of the Standards Committee, the Executive Comittee, and Section Committees of the USA Standards Committee B31.

# RAILROAD SAFETY SECTION

The primary concern of the Railroad Safety Section of the Engineering Department is the safe operation of railroads throughout the State of Missouri. To help to insure the safe operation, personnel of the section spend a great deal of time inspecting railroad equipment, tracks, railroad crossing, guard rails, and substandard clearances. Attention is also

given to personal safety of railroad employees. Inspection of shelter houses, yard offices, sanitation facilities, locker room and work areas has proved beneficial in this respect.

Deficiencies in a railroad operation which might be detrimental to safety and in viciation of the Commission's safety code are reported to the Commission by the Railroad Safety Section personnel. In most instances, the deficiencies are corrected through correspondence with officials of the companies.



When, after notification, a deficiency is not corrected voluntarily by the railroad company, the matter is brought before the Commission with recommendations from the Engineering Department and the Railroad Safety Section. If the Commission finds, after hearing, that its safety regulations have been violated, it may order the company to correct the condition and direct its General Counsel to seek statutory penalties in the Civil courts.

# Accident Investigation

An important phase of the Railroad safety Section's activities is the investigation of any railroad accident from which personal injury or death results. Upon receiving the report of such an accident, the supervisor or a field investigator inspects the scene of the accident to deter-

mine if the Commission's safety requirements were violated.

Hazardous conditions caused by careless loading operations, weeds and debris which might block vision at crossings, faulty or inoperative warning signals and substandard clearances are safety items for which the Railroad Safety Section must always be on the alert. These conditions are recorded, often by photograph, and are then reported to the Commission. These records and reports are often helpful in the event a hearing is called for the purpose of correcting a deficiency pertaining to railroad safety.

#### Governor's Committee

Because of his concern over the increase in the number of grade crossing accidents, Governor Warren E. Hearnes in 1966, named a special committee to investigate the upsurge in grade crossing accidents and recommend measures designed to reduce these accidents. Public Service Commission Chairman William R. Clarkwas designated chairman of the Committee, and the Governor requested the Public Service Commission and its staff to assist the committee in its investigations.

Last year, upon the recommendation of the Governor's Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Committee, three sets of experimental grade crossing warning signals were designed and installed at crossings considered to be dangerous. A fourth signal was installed during October, 1967. These caution signals are a standard railroad cross buck with a 12 inch flashing yellow beacon placed above and below the cross buck. One signal is installed on each side of the crossing and the alternately flashing lights operate continuously.

Observation of these warning signals



in use indicates that they affect the manner of approach to the crossing of a majority of the motorists. Most motorists have slowed their vehicles and crossed the tracks with caution. These warning signals are much less expensive than flashing lights and if they prove to be effective they should be a big factor insafety at crossings which are not heavily traveled. After a full year of operation, it is encouraging to report that no accidents have occurred at crossings protected by these signals. The consensus of opinion at this time is that use of the flashing yellow be a cons will increase in the future.

## Safety Installations

During this year the Public Service Commission approved the installation of 15 flashing light railroads signals, 18 grade separations, and 6 new or relocated grade crossings. Gates were ordered installed at 7 locations.

The following tabulation shows statistics relative to the activities of the Railroad Safety Section of the Engineering Department during the past year.

#### RATES & RESEARCH DEPARTMENT

The primary responsibility of the Rates and Research Department is the filing and maintenance of rates and tariffs for the regulated utilities operating in the State of Missouri. This department maintains a current file of utility rates, maps of certificated areas, rules and regulations for each utility, statistical information and other records which aid inutility regulation.

All new tariff filings dealing with the rates, rules and regulations for regulated utility companies in the State of Missouri are initially referred to the Rates and Research Department for processing. The department staff first reviews the filing to determine the extent in nature of the changes or additions proposed. Recommendations are then made to other members of the Commission staff and to the Commission regarding the tariff proposals. After the Commission has made its decision in matters involving rate and tariff changes or additions, the tariff processing procedure is completed and the tariff filed or suspended for further study or public hearings as ordered by the Commission.

# Tariffs Processed

During the period covered by this report, 2,371 tariff sheets were processed dealing with new tariff proposals, new rates, rate and tariff changes, and miscellaneous tariff information. During this period, 577 letters were written acknowledging and transmitting tariffs and answering inquiries to the Commission regarding utility tariffs. Members of the department staff also handle tariff inquiries made by telephone and in person at the Commission offices.

In addition to the maintenance of utility tariffs, the Rates and Research De-

partment also has the responsibility for investigating a majority of the utility customers complaints and inquiries referred to the Commission concerning the rates. rules and regulations for the utility companies under Public Service Commission jurisdiction. This year, approximately 1,400 letters were written by members of the department staff in response to customer complaints and inquiries, and requests for information from utility company officials and other individuals. Many complaints and inquiries are also handled by telephone and direct contact at the Commission offices. A majority of the complaints and requests for information received are handled on a staff level and resolved by the transmittal of tariff information and/or communication with the utility company involved. There are some complaints, however, which cannot be completely resolved at the staff level. and these are referred to the Commission Legal Department, or the Commission, for further action. In the event a public hearing results from rate and tariff complaints or filings, the department staff aids the General Counsel and his staff in the preparation for the hearing.

# Utility Conferences

A considerable amount of time is spent by the Rates and Research Department staff in conferences and discussions with officials of utility companies. These conferences may deal with existing tariffs, new tariff proposals, or other matters relating to the rates, rules and regulations of the utility companies. Good lines of communication between the staff and utility company personnel help to assure that all tariffs submitted are in proper form and comply with the General Orders of the Commission, and the laws of the State of Missouri.

The Rates and Research Department complies and maintains statistical data pertinent to the operations of the various types of public utilities in the State of Missouri regulated by the Commission. The statistical information contained in the following pages, relating to the operations of regulated public utilities, will give the reader a general idea of the development of public utilities in the State of Missouri in recent years. All statistical information is based on utility company annual reports as of December 31, 1967, unless otherwise specified.



#### MISSOURI ELECTRIC UTILITIES

Electric utilities operating in the state continued to grow at a record pace throughout the year. For the year ended December 31, 1967, the electric utilities in Missouri sold a record 24.48 billion kilowatt-hours of electric energy. This was an increase of 5.63 percent over the year ended December 31, 1966.



#### New Power Sources

The continued increase in demand for electric energy has created the necessity for new sources of supply in the state. Though there are some hydro-electric, generating plants in operation in the state, the major sources of electric energy are coal, gas and oil-fired generating plants. At the writing of this report, there are several large generating plants under construction throughout the state which will increase the generating capacity of the electric utilities in the state by several hundred thousand kilowatts. Every indication is that the need for electric energy will steadily increase in future years.

The steady increase in industrial development and increased usage by residential and commercial customers taxes the output capabilities of the electric utilities during peak demand periods. Larger air conditioning loads combined with general lighting and applicance loads require a continual search by the electric utilities for more efficient methods by which to serve their customers. A primary goal for all electric utilities is to increase usage of electric energy during off-peak periods, thereby increasing the load factor and reducing the overall cost per kilowatt-hour for electric energy. One utility operates a pump-storage hydro-electric, plant during peak periods which reduces the requirments for adding additional generating facilities that might be idle a large percentage of the time. Electric heating and all electric developments are a primary factor in electric load leveling during the off-peak Increases in interchange winter season. and interconnection agreements between companies helped to assure a continuous supply of electric energy for electric customers.


The electric utilities operating in the State of Missouri have effected many re-

ductions in rates for their customers in recent years. The past year ended June 30, 1968, was no exception, as evidenced by reductions in charges to consumers in excess of two and one-half million dollars for that period.

During the past ten years, operating revenues for the electric utilities operating in the state have increased by 107 percent, but the kilowatt-hours of electric energy sold during that same periodhave increased by more than 128 percent. Other electric utility statistics and comparisons may be found in figure No. 2. (See P. 64)

#### STEAM HEATING

There are three steam heating systems currently operating in the State of Missouri. These systems are used to supply steam primarily for space heating in certain areas of our larger cities where there exists a concentration of commercial and industrial development requiring this service. Though these systems have been in existence for many years, they have not expanded greatly in recent years, primarily because the advent of natural gas into our cities for use as a space heating fuel has decreased the demand for steam heat.

#### NATURAL GAS UTILITIES

During the past year, natural gas distribution facilities have been extended for the first time to many areas in Missouri. Investment in natural gas distribution facalities in 1967 by Missouri companies reached a record figure in excess of 385 million dollars, reflecting an 86 percent increase in plant investment during the past ten years. During this period, the number of gas customers served has increased by only 26 percent, indicating that Missouri natural gas utilities are investing more money per customer in order to provide more Missouri residents with natural gas service.

Natural gas is supplied to the State of Missouri by interstate pipeline companies whose lines extend from the natural gas fields in states primarily to the west and southwest of Missouri. Allocations of additional natural gas supplies from the pipeline companies are under the jurisdiction of the Federal Power Commission, from whom the authority for additional supplies enabling them to extend their facilities into new areas and increase natural gas coverage in previously certificated areas.

Considerable gains have also been made in the provision of "firm" gas service to many customers who had previously been served only on an interruptible basis, due to limitations of the amount of gas which could be obtained from the pipeline companies, especially during peak periods. The peak demands for natural gas are for periods during the winter months when the service is required for space heating uses. Since most gas utilities purchase their gas on a demand rate which is affected by the peak demand requirements on an annual basis, the utilities are constantly searching for ways to improve the load factor in their systems. They seek to utilize more gas in the off-peak periods since the high demand has been established during the winter, and additional usage during the off-peak periods helps to lower the overall cost of gas. Some of the methods used to improve load factor and reduce demand requirements are undergroundgas storage facilities, peak-shaving with liquefied petroleum gas, and the promotion of total energy installations, gas air conditioning and other installations which have a good load factor and use more gas during off-peak periods. The total energy plant is a system which uses natural gas to supply electricity, heat, hot water and air conditioning for a limited This type of operation has a good load factor and is used primarily in large schools, apartment complexes and other developments of this type. Though a relatively new innovation, several total energy plants are in operation in the State of Missouri, and others are in the planning and construction stages.

Though there are many factors which control the cost of the provision of natural gas service, the primary one being the purchased cost of gas, the natural gas utilities operating in the state continue their search for new and more economical ways

to provide natural gas service in an attempt to prevent large increases in natural gas rates. Table No. 3 contains statistics for the operation of Missouri natural gas utilities over the past 10-year period. Though

increases in rates are reflected due to the increasing costs of providing service, the percentage rate increases compare favorably with the increased investment made by the utilities.



#### WATER UTILITIES

An adequate, potable water supply is a major concern of every resident in the State of Missouri. The growth of suburban residential areas, new industrial development and the increases in usage per capita of the residential customer have created ever increasing demands for more water on the water utilities operating in the state.


Though Missouri has a large number of surface sources for water supply in its numerous rivers and streams, the cost of transporting and treating that water supply often makes it impractical to use. Wells then, become the chief source of water supply for areas not having adequate demand for the justification of treatment plants, and for those areas not in close proximity to an adequate surface source of water supply.

To meet the need for the increased demands for safe water, the water utilities operating in the State of Missouri are expending increased amounts of money each year to locate and develop new sources of water supply and establish treatment plants to insure the water is safe for human consumption. During the past year, investment in water utility plant by water companies regulated by this Commission has increased to a point near 137 million dollars, an increase of approximately 3 million dollars above last years figure. The additional expenditures were for development of new water sources, the development and expansion of existing sources and the expansion of distribution facilities required to transport the water to the customer.

The chart in Figure 6 indicates that the number of water customers for regulated water utilities has increased at a rather constant rate over the past ten years. The usage by these customers, however,

has shown sharp increases during the past three years, probably caused by the larger per capita usage and the industrial development previously mentioned. This trend is an indication that the water companies operating in the State of Missouri will be called upon to provide more and more water to their customers in future years.





#### SEWER UTILITIES

Governor Warren E. Hearnes on June 1, 1967, signed into law emergency legislation which renewed the Public Service Commission's regulatory control over private sewer systems operating as public utilities in Missouri. This new law, because of its emergency clause, became effective immediately.

The statute, known as Senate Bill No. 106 of the 74th General Assembly of Missouri, corrected certain deficiencies set out in a declaratory judgment by the Cole County Circuit Court which had found the former statute unconstitutional. That opinion was sought by the Valley Sewage Co., St. Louis, County, after it had been requested by the PSC to conform to the law pertaining to sewer utilities and to file application for certification to operate within the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission. The company challenged the Commission's legal authority to regulate its operations under the old law and asked the opinion of the courts.

On December 1, 1966, when the Cole County Court opinion was handed down, the Commission was involved in 17 formal matters concerning sewer utility operations. Therewere 71 additional companies operating sewer utilities which had been informed of their need to operate under rules of the Commission. The opinion of the Circuit Court was not appealed by the Commission. The Commission deemed it more expeditious to seek new legislation in the 74th General Assembly which convened in January, 1967.

After passage of Senate Bill No. 106, the Public Service Commission immediately became active in an intensified program of enforcement of the new law. By the end of June, 1967, the Commission had reinstituted many of its old sewer cases, which had been dropped during the period when jurisdiction over sewer utilities was in question. The Commission in June mailed information concerning the new statute to each known sewer company and builder of sewer systems.

Three weeks after the Senate Bill became law, the Public Service Commission became involved in its first rate case concerning a sewer utility. (Jefferson County Sewer Co. June 21, 1967) Two sewer companies (Jefferson County Sewer Co. and Heatherbrook Sewer Co.) voluntarily came under Public Service Commission jurisdiction claiming

the Grandfather clause almost immediately after the bill became law and 31 (thirty-one) other companies filed applications for certification to operate within the jurisdiction of the Commission.

Prior to losing jurisdiction over sewer company operations, the Public Service Commission had a number of cases pending final disposition. All sewer matters were dropped awaiting new legislation which would strengthen regulatory controls over these operations.

Among the sewer issuespending were numerous complaint cases. One such case, involving Fee Fee Trunk Sewer, Inc., concerned complaints of sewage backup in basements of a subdivision in St. Louis County served by the company. This case had been heard shortly before the December 1, 1966, ruling by the Cole County Circuit Court.

Immediately after the June 1, 1967, enactment of new sewer controls, the Commission hired a consulting engineer to make an engineering study of the sewer system operated by Fee Fee in the area of complaints. Another public hearing was scheduled so that the results of that study together with information gathered by the Commission staff in its investigation could be recorded.

The Commission had decided that the public interest and need for immediate relief from the sewage problems of the subdivision involved in the complaints of sewage backups demanded immediate attention. An interim order was issued ordering certain alterations of design to the system and the disconnecting of downspouts from the sanitary sewers. The deficiencies were further corrected by the company's construction of a relief sewer line. All improvements were ordered prior to the rainy season of early spring, 1968.

Another sewer complaint resulted in the Commission's immediate action in the interests of the public. That case involved Spanish Lake Service, Inc. Customers of a subdivision served by that firm complained of sewage backups into basements of homes.

Staff studies showed certain inadequacies of design and indicated the company had a lax program of sewer system maintenance. An interim order was issued by the Commission calling for corrective measures to protect homeowners in the area served.

Adequacy of design studies are being made on three sewer companies: Fee Fee Trunk Sewer, Inc., St. Louis County Sewer Co., and Spanish Lake Service. Inc.



A third interim order, to give immediate relief to sewer problems pending the Commission's final decision, was issued to the Jefferson County Sewer Co -- the first sewer rate case. An interim increase was granted that company on March 14, 1968, which should afford the company needed operating capital. The Commission directed the Utilities Division to prepare an original cost and depreciation study so that the interim rates could be verified.

A heavy accumulation of correspondence has flowed steadily to and from the Commission since jurisdiction over sewer companies was established on June 1, 1967. Letters, copies of the new law, questionnaires and survey data have been sent in the form of numerous mailings to mayors and city managers, to 165 builders of sewage disposal works and to all known sewer companies operating in this State. Communications have involved advising the companies of the new law and showing them how to determine if they are subject to state regulatory jurisdiction under the new law.

The increased work load involved in the enforcement of sewer regulations has entailed the reorganization of the Commission's manpower to handle the added responsibilities and the hiring of additional professional personnel.

The Commission has employed one new engineer and two professional interns to work with an experienced engineer and engineer aide in field investigations. This five-man team is presently working on original cost studies in the St. Louis area.

Secretarial personnel and professional engineers augment the work of this task force from the Jefferson City offices of the Public Service Commission. The scope of duties ranges from answering complaint letters from the general public to preparing technical data for use inhearings on sewer matters before the Commission.



During the first year of sewer regulation under the new statute, the Commission has certificated nine sewer companies to operate as sewer utilities. This, involved the company filing an application for a certificate of convenience and necessity; a hearing date set; the hearing before the Commission and a final Report & Order issued. There were two exceptions. Two of the nine companies listed below voluntarily came under PSC jurisdiction relying on Grandfather rights. (Indicated below\*)

#### Investigations Continue

Hearing dates have been set for the following sewer companies whose applications for certificates of Convenience and Necessity are on file. Those seven applications (pending as of July 1, 1968) will be heard in August and September.

Ten sewer companies are currently under investigation by the Commission on matters ranging from investigation as to adequacy of design and adequacy of service to determining if the company involved is under Commission jurisdiction. All ten companies have formal matters pending before the Commission. Some have been heard, others partially heard and still others are awaiting hearing dates.

Since June 1, 1967, the staff has investigated over 150 sewer systems and has found that as of June 30, 1968, these systems do not come under the jurisdiction of the Commission. Continual surveillance is required for a large portion of these systems to determine if and when they should be brought under Commission jurisdiction.

The new Missouri statute restating Public Service Commission regulation over sewer utilities provides that sewer companies will be assessed the same as other Missouri public utilities in order to pay for the costs of regulation. That assessment is based in total gross intrastate revenue produced by the company.



#### TELEPHONE UTILITIES

Growth of the telephone industry in Missouri continues at an impressive rate. During the past ten years, the number of telephones in service has increased more than 85 percent to a total of 2,451,771 telephones as of June 30, 1967. Figure 8 shows the increase in total number of telephone stations for the State of Missouri over this ten-year period.

Customers of the telephone companies operating in the state are demanding more complete telephone coverage, improved classes of service and more sophisticated communication equipment to keep pace with the rapid residential and industrial development in the state. To satisfy the demands of its customers, the telephone industry is making record expenditures for plant and facilities. By the end of 1967, telephone plant investment in the state had reached the figure of \$1,156,723,439. Over the past several years. have exceeded 100 million dollars per year, causing a rapid rise in the plant investment figure.

A sizeable portion of the industry's construction budget for the past year has gone into upgrading party line service. Most companies in the state are now working toward a goal of private line service for all customers inside exchange base rate areas, and rural service with a maximum of four parties to a line. There are now in existence several exchanges in both the urban and rural areas. The trend for the future appears to be private line telephone service provided through underground systems, thereby eliminating most of the service and trouble complaints for the telephone company.

Extended area service, or toll free calling between exchanges, has been established in several areas in the past year. To provide this service, the addition of trunk lines and central office equipment is required between the exchanges The largest projects of this involved. type are still under construction and are the Wide Area Service Plans for metropolitan St. Louis and metropolitan Kansas These projects are scheduled to be completed and the service established by December of 1968. This program will virtually eliminate inter-zone calls in the state's two largest metropolitan areas.

The development and installation of Direct Distance Dialing, Touch Tone systems (push button dialing), data transmitting and recording equipment, improved private branch exchange systems and more sophisticated transmission equipment has revolutionized the communications industry in recent years. The energy and resources of the industry are being expended at an ever-increasing rate to meet the challenges of the world of today.


One relatively new development in the telephone industry is Improved Mobile Telephone Service, a radio-telephone service by which the customer may place and receive calls from a mobile unit in much the same way as with standard telephone services. Some customers may now dial their calls from their mobile units, but in some areas the operation of the service still requires an operator.


With record amounts being spent on telephone construction each year for the design and development of new facilities and concepts, there appears to be no end in sight for the growth of the telephone industry in Missouri.

#### WESTERN UNION

Western Union is one of the oldest utilities operating in the State of Missouri. To day it can hardly be recognized as the same utility which started out with single-key telegraph installations in the various railroad towns throughout the country. Since Western Union's intrastate system is so closely tied with its world-wide network, the information in this report refers to the company's entire operation.

Although the telegram message business is still the largest single source of revenue for Western Union, it today represents less than 1/6 of the company's total message volume. The company's modernization and expansion program is aimed at development of long-term potential

projects for the company, the majority of which are associated with leased systems and record service.

Telegram message services, declining in use, still produce almost 1/2 of Western Union's revenue, \$156,000,000 in 1967. More than 80% of all telegrams sent are for business purposes and usually apply to the distribution of raw materials and materials manufactured goods. Telegram money order service is also included in the telegram message services. grams and money orders, unlike the newer, customer-operated services must be accepted, transmitted and delivered by Western Union employees. Therefore, constant attention is required to maintain efficiency and provide a high quality of service.



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
