# Missouri Public Service Commission

The purpose of the Public Service Commission is the regulation of the adequacy of service, safety of operation, and reasonableness of rates of 8,000 utilities and transportation companies in Missouri.

It has no jurisdiction over municipallyowned utilities, and its regulation of rural electric cooperatives is limited to the safety of their operations. Cooperatives may voluntarily place themselves under complete regulation, and two -- Sho-Me Power Corporation of Marshfield and Citizens Electric Corporation of Ste. Genevieve -- have elected to do so.

Consumers benefit from regulation through guarantees of adequate, safe service at reasonable rates, while the regulated companies and those who invest in them are assured a reasonable return on their capital.

In setting rates, the commission must maintain a balance between these two main interests. If rates are excessive, consumers will suffer, while if they are insufficient to allow the company to attract capital, consumers and the company will be injured because the company will be unable to finance expansion and replacements.

The PSC was organized in its present form in 1913. Its earliest predecessor was the Board of Railroad Commissioners, which was established by the General Assembly in 1875. The Board was later given authority over grain warehouses and railway express companies. When the PSC was created, regulation of grain warehouses was not extended to it.



SAM L. MANLEY, Secretary to the Commission, is the personnel and administrative officer for the commission. The Secretary's office handles applications filed with the commission, schedules hearing dates, and processes and prints all orders issued by the PSC.



A. S. FORSYTHE, Director of Public Information, disseminates information about commission activities through the news media, this Annual Report, and other publications. The public information office assists other sections in the preparation and printing of reports and speeches, and participates in planning and conducting meetings and conferences. By 1913, the regulation of utilities had been attempted by the courts, the legislature, communities, and local commissions, but none of these approaches was satisfactory. Neither the courts nor the General Assembly had time to devote to regulatory matters, while the towns and local commissions lacked funds to function adequately.

The Public Service Commission, which was modeled after the New York PSC, was created so that the regulation of utilities and related matters would be administered in a central location, by an office with sufficient funds and professional personnel to perform its duties swiftly and economically.

From its offices on the ninth and tenth floors of the Jefferson State Office Building in Jefferson City, the PSC regulates 12 types of companies, whose numbers at the end of 1971-72 fiscal year were:

The commission's duties include inspection and investigation of various utility operations, response to complaints, promulgation of rules and regulations, and probably most time-consuming, the investigation, hearing and disposition of rate cases.

The size of the commission's task is perhaps best indicated by the fact that the value of property owned by the regulated companies in 1972 was \$5,545,000,000 and their revenues for the year were \$1,507,000,000. Because of the number of companies it regulates and their worth, the Public Service Commission probably has a greater influence upon Missourians than any other state agency.

A staff of 180 assists the five members of the commission in these activities. Most of the staff members are professionals in the fields of accounting, engineering, law, economics, and rates. The commissioners are appointed by the governor for six-year offset terms so that no more than two terms expire within one year. By tradition rather than by statute, three members are of the majority party and two are of the minority party.


The commission's workload expanded during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, as a result of general orders issued in 1971 concerning the undergrounding of electric lines in new subdivisions and the prohibition of certain promotional practices of gas and electric utilities. The commission is working on new rules and regulations governing railroad inspections of tracks, bridges, and roadbeds that were required by legislation passed in 1971. Also underway is a proposed revision of railroad accident reporting regulations and work on rules and regulations governing sewer companies.

The process of implementing the use of electronic data processing in the activities of the commission was carried on during the year, as was the commission's sponsorship of the Regulatory Information Systems Conference (RISC). The conference is held annually to facilitate the adoption of EDP by regulatory agencies throughout the United States. The commission does not have its own computer, but shares time on the computers of the Division of Mental Health, the

Administrative Services Section, and the Highway Department.



F. D. HEQUEMBOURG, Director of Utilities, oversees the operations of the Accounting and Engineering Departments in their work with regulated utilities. In the 1971-72 fiscal year there were 13 electric, 20 gas, 17 mobile telephone, 29 sewer, 4 steam, one telegraph, 58 telephone, and 49 water companies under PSC jurisdiction. Utility rate cases, as in the past few years, required a major portion of the commission's attention. The 38 cases before the PSC during the fiscal year was the second highest in commission history, exceeded only by the 51 cases during the previous fiscal year.

As long as the economy continues to drive utility costs upward, the number of rate cases is expected to continue at or near the level experienced during 1971-72.

Of the rate cases decided during the fiscal year, the commission allowed the amount requested in only three. Less than the proposed increase was granted in 13 cases and in one case the entire amount requested was denied. Four rate proposals were withdrawn during the fiscal year and 17 were pending as of June 30, 1972.

Utility rate increases filed with the commission can be suspended for a maximum period of 10 months to allow time for investigation and hearings. The PSC staff, which represents the people of Missouri in proceedings before the commission, uses this time, as do the company and intervenors in the case, to prepare and submit evidence, conduct cross-examination and present final arguments.

Missouri railroads were permitted during the fiscal year to raise rates by 2-1/2 percent on intrastate shipments, which corresponded to an increase granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission on interstate traffic. Upon protests from interested parties, the commission suspended that portion of the increase that would apply to carload lots of some farm products and fertilizers. Earlier in the fiscal year, increases of 18 to 20 percent on those same classes of products had been allowed following suspension in earlier cases. They also matched ICC raises. In allowing the higher rates, the commission said the railroads' revenues were increasing, but operating expenses were climbing at a greater pace.

Similar rising costs were being experienced by truck firms in Missouri, who also requested higher rates. In February, 1972, household movers were allowed a 10 percent increase in rates, half of the amount they had requested. The commission permitted the proposed 20 percent increase in packing and other fees to go into effect. General commodities carriers were granted an increase by the commission that averaged 8.64 percent and corresponded to a rate hike approved by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Dump truck operators, citing rising costs and expenses, filed a request for a 40 percent increase that was pending at the end of the year. In November, 1971, an interim dump truck increase of 14.6 percent for construction work and 5 percent for most other hauling was made permanent by the PSC.

The cases dealt with by the commission during the fiscal year are listed alphabetically by name of company or individual in the appendix of this report.

After the close of the fiscal year, the PSC was certified by the Federal Price Commission to make determinations as to whether rate increases meet the criteria of the Economic Stabilization Act of 1970. As a result of the certification, Missouri companies no longer have to submit increases to the Price Commission for approval, but the commission must show in each order that price regulations have been adhered to.



GEORGE G. FOX, Director of Transportation, is responsible for matters relating to bus, truck, and railroad rates and services. The Transportation Division includes the enforcement, insurance, license and records, operating rights, rates, and audits sections. There were 228 bus companies, 26 railroads, one railway express firm, and 7,546 truck companies under PSC jurisdiction during the fiscal year.



ROBERT B. JOHNSON, Chief Hearing Examiner, and the other hearing examiners assist the commission by conducting hearings and drafting reports and orders. The examiners also perform research for the commissioners, participate in conferences on the application of PSC law and write proposed or revised commission rules as regulation changes. A precedent-setting directive was issued by the commission in May, 1972, that established strict standards of conduct designed to remove the commission and its employes from any contact with the public relations activities of companies under its jurisdic-The directive forbids commission memtion. bers and employes from accepting gifts from regulated companies and forbids acceptance of meals, gratuities, goods, services, or travel of any kind. Commission members. employes and the regulated companies are required by the directive to file monthly reports of contacts concerning PSC business.

The five commissioners said in issuing the ruling that they and the PSC employes must maintain a completely neutral stance. Their neutrality must be completely apparent to the public so all citizens will realize cases are judged on their merits, and that the primary concern of the PSC is the public interest.

Members of the public made greater use of the PSC than in the previous year. The number of contacts with the public increased, as did the participation of citizens in cases before the commission. Phone calls and letters regarding complaints and requests for information about utility matters totaled 13,704, compared with 11,703 in the preceding year.

In four rate cases -- Southwestern Bell Telephone, Union Electric, Capital City Telephone, and Midstate Telephone -- the commission held additional hearings at which interested individuals could testify in regard to service or other matters involving the utilities. The commission in the Southwestern Bell and Union Electric cases went to Saint Louis in order that the hearings could more conveniently be attended by the companies' customers. Capital City and Midstate customers are located in or near Jefferson City. The commission has always tried to take as much evidence as is practicable and to allow as many persons as possible to testify. It has frequently gone to other cities to conduct hearings, but is now increasing its exposure throughout the state and attempting to obtain a broader view of consumer opinion, particularly in rate cases.

In addition to its work in Missouri, the commission represents the people of Missouri in cases before federal agencies or before Congress or at conferences on regulation. The commission intervened in one Interstate Commerce Commission case and two Federal Power Commission cases during the 1971-72 fiscal year. During that period there were 12 cases pending before the ICC and 16 pending before the FPC in which the Missouri PSC was engaged.

A good indicator of the work of the commission during the year is the time spent in the hearing room, which totaled 1,088 hours and resulted in 34,766 pages of transcript, a sharp increase from 929 hours and 29,170 pages in the 1970-71 fiscal year.

Cases filed with the commission for the fiscal year totaled 2,199, an increase of 434 over the total of 1,765 in the previous year. Hearings were conducted in 911 cases, up from 819, or an increase of 92. The number of orders issued by the commission was 7,545, or 1,151 greater than during the preceding year.

Nineteen appeals were brought on commission decisions and 12 appeals brought prior to the fiscal year were closed.

The general counsel's office filed two suits for statutory penalties, two injunctions, one writ of mandamus, and four writs of prohibition. That office also filed two

JEREMIAH D. FINNEGAN, General Counsel, represents the general public in cases before the commission with the assistance of other sections of the PSC staff. The General Counsel also intervenes before federal regulatory commissions on behalf of the people of Missouri. Opinions on matters of regulatory law are issued by the office of the General Counsel. actions for declaratory judgments. Five formal opinions were issued by the general counsel in response to specific requests and countless informal opinions were offered. Over 1,100 letters were sent by the general counsel's office during the year.

Railroad, truck, and bus tariffs and schedules filed with the commission in the period of this report totaled 7,045, up from 6,935 in the previous year.

For failure to comply with commission requirements, the permits of 458 carriers were revoked during the year, compared to 238 in the previous year. Inspectors of the enforcement section drove 130,000 miles in the performance of their duties, contacting 2,950 motor carriers. The number of contacts was down from 4,107 in the preceding year, but the number of safety inspections more than doubled, from 2,215 to 5,479. Of the vehicles inspected, 141 were taken out of service until defects were corrected.

Investigations of unlawful operations totaled 361, compared with 398 the year before. Inspectors investigated 170 accidents and made 172 checks of bus stations for cleanliness and safety. Insurance cancellations accounted for the suspension of 1,688 motor carriers, compared with 1,663 in the 1970-71 fiscal year. Of those suspended, 1,041 were reinstated upon filing notice of proper insurance.

The tariffs filed by utility companies totaled 3,950, down from 5,030 in the previous year, a decline attributable to the fewer number of rate cases. On the other hand, the number of complaints and the time involved with the complaints increased as the public has become more aware of the commission's role. Complaints concerning utility rates and tariffs numbered 1,239, up from 989 in the previous year. There were 495 field investigations of complaints, 399 more than in the 1970-71 fiscal year. The greater number of investigations is largely due to an increase in complaints concerning water and sewer companies that necessitated more than one investigation.

More than 6,800 letters were written in regard to utility complaints, information requests, and tariffs, compared to 5,600 in the earlier year; while telephone calls, conferences, and other contacts dealing with utilities totaled 7,450, up from 6,480 in the year before.

The Engineering Department conducted 16 investigations of gas incidents, one fewer than the year before, and made 85 gas safety inspections, 44 more than in the previous year. Each of the 21 gas distribution companies was checked several times during the year. Railroad safety field inspections numbered 1,031, an increase of 117 over the previous year.

Two company appraisals were made by the Engineering Department, up from one a year ago. The department completed 10 depreciation rate studies, against 12 in the previous fiscal year and participated in 11 rate cases, three more than in the earlier year.

Electrical undergrounding authority orders issued by the Engineering Department totaled 238 during the year. The department issued 47 authority orders concerning utility promotional practices. Virtually all of these orders necessitated an on-site investigation prior to the issuance of the authority.



JOHN O. RICHEY, Chief Engineer, directs the operations of sections dealing with utility rates, safety and service, and that conduct studies of utility plant values. This department is responsible for the implementation of recent PSC orders that govern undergrounding of electric lines and which prohibit certain utility promotional practices.



ROBERT E. SEMB, Chief Accountant, and his staff conduct audits of regulated companies for use in rate cases and other proceedings before the commission. The Accounting Department reviews annual reports filed by the companies and also performs compliance audits, special investigations, and statistical studies. It is anticipated that during the 1972-73 fiscal year, work will be completed on a uniform standard of construction and maintenance of the supply and communications systems of electric and telephone companies.

The Accounting Department conducted 37 audits and examinations, 12 of which were major audits, in the 1971-72 fiscal period. The department is presently working on 10 audits and examinations that are expected to be completed during the current fiscal year.

The information obtained in these audits and examinations is used by the commission staff to determine the original cost of the property used in public service and the financial condition of the utilities.


Securities with a total value of \$981,503,817 were issued during the 1971-72 fiscal year by utilities under PSC jurisdiction. An authority fee is paid the commission after it examines and approves utility securities issues. The reason for the issuance of \$847,404,400 in securities was the refunding of outstanding indebtedness. The total of \$134,099,417 in securities remaining represented new capital securities. The types and amounts of the securities are shown in Table A on Page 14.

The money from which the Public Service Commission budget is appropriated is obtained from the regulated companies, thus making the PSC one of the few self-supporting government agencies. Revenues from the assessment of utilities goes to the Public Service Commission Fund, while receipts from motor carrier license stickers are deposited in the State Highway Department Fund. The General Assembly appropriates the PSC budget from these two funds. If there is a balance in the PSC Fund, it is carried over to the next year, while any remainder in the Highway Department Fund is absorbed into general highway funds. Authority fees and miscellaneous fees are credited directly to the state general revenue fund.

The utility assessments, which are subject to commission approval, are allocated on the basis of the companies' gross revenues during the prior year. The assessments for the 1972-73 fiscal year were \$1,600,820, compared with \$1,350,000 for the previous fiscal year. The assessment by types of utility is shown on Table B on Page 14.

The sale of motor carrier license stickers brought total revenues of \$1,209,612, a 9.8 percent increase over the \$1,101,563 the previous year. The collections, by month and type of carrier, are shown in Table C on Page 14.

Authority and miscellaneous fees of \$13,273 and \$25,772, respectively, were collected during the fiscal year. The total of \$39,045 was somewhat higher than that of \$35,095 in the previous fiscal year.



GILBERT E. HOFFMAN, Chief, Internal Services, is in charge of PSC accounts and assists the commission in preparation of the annual budget. The budget during the period of this report was \$2,066,603, and was increased by the General Assembly to \$2,456,925 for the 1972-73 fiscal year to accommodate the addition of 20 employes.
