# Missouri Public Service Commission Annual Report

The Missouri Public Service Commission is a regulatory agency created by the legislature to administer state laws governing the operation of privately-owned utility and transportation companies. Its duties range from resolving customer complaints to establishing rates for companies following audits and public hearings. In addition to administering existing laws, the Commission may issue regulations of its own within the framework of the statutes.

The need for the Public Service Commission came about as a result of the development of railroads and utilities, which are most economical when allowed to function as monopolies. The regulatory agency acts as a control on these monopolies much as competition does on the open market, and affords customers of the regulated companies a mechanism for resolving conflicts between themselves and the companies.

The Missouri General Assembly created the Public Service Commission in 1913. Later, the Commission's authority was broadened to include regulation of bus and truck companies, sewer utilities and the safety of operation of rural electric cooperatives. Municipally owned utilities and the rates and services of rural electric cooperatives are exempt from Public Service Commission regulation. The Commission's responsibility is to ensure that customers receive safe, adequate service at reasonable rates and that investors in regulated companies receive a reasonable return on their investment. A staff of 175 assists the Commission in its work, which entails investigations, studies, audits, hearings and the issuance of reports on each formal case. The five members of the Commission are appointed for six-year terms by the Governor, who designates one as chairman. By tradition, three of the Commissioners are of the same political party as the Governor, while two are of the other party.

During the fiscal year 1972-1973 and the period following the close of the fiscal year, the Public Service Commission, in addition to its customary work in regulating utility and transportation firms in Missouri, initiated investigations into new areas of regulation and assumed new responsibilities at the direction of the General Assembly.

Among these were the regulation of the safety of mobile homes and recreational vehicles; the reorganization of the Commission's transportation investigation section; commencement of an investigation of guidelines for toll-free calling; issuance of proposed safety standards for electric utilities, rural electric cooperatives and telephone companies; an investigation and proposed rule-making proceeding covering utility contracts; continuation of the Commission's study of burial of electric lines; issuance of regulations requiring burial of telephone lines, and adoption of federal railroad safety rules.

The number of utility cases under consideration by the Commission during the fiscal year was approximately the same as in the period-34, compared with 38 in the 1971-1972 fiscal year. In the 34 cases before the PSC in the latest fiscal year, the utility was allowed a lesser amount than requested in 13 cases; the full amount was granted in seven cases, in one case no increase was allowed. At the end of the year, 13 cases were pending before the Commission.

The abrupt increase in the number of utility rate cases over the past few years is directly attributable to the inflationary condition of the economy at large. The only way that regulated companies can obtain relief from the effects of inflation is through a rate increase proceeding before the Public Service Commission. Unlike other industries, regulated firms cannot cut back during periods of adverse economic conditions, but must be ready at all times to provide service to those who request it. The only exception to this is the curtailment of expansion by gas distribution companies, which was required as a result of the shortage of natural gas.

As long as inflation continues at a rate that cannot be met through normal growth, the utilities throughout the nation-not just Missouri-are expected to seek rate increases more frequently than in the past. The Commission's recent order permitting electric utilities to pass on fluctuations in fuel costs to all customers as they occur may reduce some of the pressures on those companies.

The present energy situation in the United States is a major consideration of the Public Service Commission. An inquiry was begun in December 1973 when the Commission ordered electric utilities in the state to submit reports on their energy production and the amount of petroleum products used in generation. The PSC at the same time requested municipally owned electric systems and electric cooperatives, which are not under PSC jurisdication, to furnish the same data to the Commission.

The purpose of the survey is to determine the state's energy-producting capacity and to help in forecasting fuel needs for the near future. The survey complements a similar study undertaken by the Federal Power Commission, which is attempting to determine the overall generating capacity in the United States so as to identify those areas that have surplus power. The Public Service Commission is concerned not only with the ability of electric utilities to supply Missouri consumers, but also with the matter of exporting electricity from the state. If electricity is sent to other states by Federal Power Commission order, the Public Service Commission wants to ensure that Missouri's demands are still met and that the price for the exported power is sufficient to cover costs so that Missouri customers will not be subsidizing those outside the state.

The Commission also has underway an investigation to determine whether some measures to further conserve supplies of natural gas would be feasible. The primary area of concentration of the investigation will be improvement of insulation in homes. The study, and conferences with gas utilities, will include methods by which the utilities can encourage homeowners to install sufficient insulation to achieve efficient utilization of natural gas. Possibilities include advertising to promote insulation, consultation with customers on their insulation needs and allowing utilities to make loans to homeowners to pay for insulation. The Commission believes a substantial conservation of natural gas could be realized by improving insulation, due to the number of uninsulated and under-insulated residential units in the state.

To date, the gas distribution utilities in Missouri have sufficient supplies of fuel to meet the demands of present customers. The PSC, and the companies under its jurisdiction, are prepared to meet shortages of natural gas if they should occur by curtailing supplies to low-priority users. The higher priorities are assigned to those for whom natural gas is essential, such as residences and institutions.

In order to improve supplies of natural gas, the Commission in 1973 granted authority to Laclede Gas Company of St. Louis to charge costs of gas exploration to utility expenses, within limits. Although there are risks in such ventures, the Commission said, the exploration effort of Laclede can provide the utility with gas supplies not obtainable from the pipeline companies. Laclede will be allowed to charge to utility expense an amount equal to 2 and 1/2 per cent of its operating revenues for the prior fiscal year. The company also will be required to make reports to the PSC on its exploration activities.

As a result of the exploration, Laclede is expected to be able to receive gas at prices lower than it would otherwise pay, and customers of the utility would benefit from profits of a successful operation. Laclede's first success was in Texas, in association with Freeport Oil and Mississippi River Transmission Corporation, which is the major supplier to Laclede. That venture is ultimately to bring about 13 million cubic feet of gas per day to Laclede and its divisions, St. Charles Gas, Midwest Missouri Gas and Missouri Natural Gas.

In July, 1973, announcement was made by Union Electric Company of St. Louis of its intent to construct the first nuclear-powered electric generating plant in Missouri. The 2,400-megawatt facility, if approved by the Public Service Commission and the Atomic Energy Commission, is expected to begin operation in 1981. It will be located 20 miles northeast of Jefferson City in Callaway County.

Later in 1973 the Commission gave its approval to Kansas City Power & Light Company and St. Joseph Light & Power Company to construct in a joint venture a 600-megawatt coal-fired generating plant on the Missouri River near Weston. This plant is expected to go into service in 1979.

Developments such as these will ensure that Missourians will have sufficient supplies of electricity to meet their needs in the years ahead. This state has more than adequate reserves of generating capacity now and is expected to continue to be able to expand to absorb residential, commercial and industrial demands as the state progresses.

In February, 1973, the Commission issued an order to begin an investigation of utility construction and procurement. The proposed order, in its present form, would require all utilities to file a statement on their policies concerning procurement of equipment, materials and services, and the letting of construction contracts. It would apply to all companies with Missouri gross revenues of more than \$1 million.

The area covered by the order would include the degree of notice given to suppliers, the extent of competition for bids, procedures on the opening of sealed bids, negotiations with bidders, and circumstances under which negotiations are made without competition.

The Commission continued during the fiscal year its work on guidelines for burial of electric lines. The first rules, concerning mandatory burial of lines in new subdivisions, were issued in 1971. The phase on which the Commission now is working deals with burial of lines for distribution systems in high-density commercial areas, such as shopping centers.

A great many complaints and inquiries have been received by the Commission in the past few years on the subject of toll calls between nearby communities. The resolution of this type of complaint is difficult because of the differing opinions of telephone customers toward paying increased charges for toll-free service.

The Commission in 1973 initiated a statewide investigation of toll-free calling in an attempt to set standards governing the provisions of wide areas telephone service. The PSC is now bringing together studies made by telephone companies and the PSC staff on wide area calling, and is expected to hold hearings on the matter in 1974. While the investigation is underway, all individual cases concerning wide area calling will be held in abeyance. The PSC staff also is working on quality of service standards for telephone companies. These will give the Commission, the companies and telephone users a base on which to evaluate service. The proposed service standards will cover such items as frequency of complaints, service failures and response to complaints. Prior to being put into force, the standards are expected to be the subject of discussions and hearings before the Commission.

Proposed standards were issued by the Commission in 1973 that would govern the safety of operation of electric utilities, rural electric cooperatives and telephone companies. A uniform, statewide code, similar to the PSC code on gas safety, is expected to improve the safety of service provided by these utilities. In the past, the Commission has taken safety regulations under consideration on a case-by-case basis, but that procedure has become unwieldy and increases the Commission's caseload. The proposed regulations are intended to prevent hazards resulting from the installation, operation, maintenance, removal and abandonment of electric and telephone facilities.

The Commission's success with the regulations requiring the burial of electric lines in new subdivisions led to the issuance in 1973 of similar rules for mandatory underground placement of telephone lines in such areas. The statewide order eliminated uncertainty caused by varying municipal ordinances and rules of different telephone companies, and provide for the orderly transition from overhead to buried lines. As with electric undergrounding, the PSC plans to examine the matter of burying telephone lines in areas other than new subdivisions.

Work was completed in 1973 on rules and regulations governing the operation of sewer utilities in the state, a project that was begun in 1971. General Order No. 54 sets standardized operating procedures for sewer utilities, with resultant improvement in the safety, reliability and soundness of sewer systems. The areas covered by the General Order are design, construction and operation, including inspection procedures; tariff filing procedures, record-keeping standards and rules governing the reporting of accidents or other emergencies.

In accordance with legislation passed in 1973, the PSC began a program for enforcing safety standards covering mobile homes and recreational vehicles manufactured or sold in Missouri. Under the new law, the PSC will promulgate rules and regulations, inspect units and issue certification seals for the equipment. Revenue from the sale of the seals will support the program. A portion of the new law that requires mobile homes to be properly anchored will be enforced by the Missouri Division of Health.

The first phase of the PSC program requires manufacturers to identify units with serial numbers and certify that the equipment meets the requirements of the American National Standards Institute. The next phase will include the preparation and publication of a Missouri Uniform Standards Code, the establishment of inspection criteria and the establishment of reciprocity agreements with other states.

The Missouri PSC Transportation Division is now working on quality of service standards for the bus and truck industry in the state with the aim of improving the operations of companies in the industry. Also underway is an investigation of the household goods moving industry, which is expected to result in the establishment of service standards to improve carrier operations.

Bus lines in Missouri during the fiscal year requested increases in passenger fares, express rates and charter rates to offset rising expenses. The Commission approved increases in passenger fares of about 10 percent for 10 companies, and approved increases of approximately 10 percent in express rates requested by 17 carriers. Those raises brought Missouri fares in line with those in other states, but still below express charges and per-mile passenger fares used in interstate service. The Commission denied the charter rate increase request because the proposed changes were not related to cost of service. The PSC directed its staff to investigate charter practice and rates of the intrastate carriers in Missouri.

Dump truck operators had requested a 40 per cent increase in rates in 1972, and had proposed that 20 per cent of the amount be granted immediately on an interim basis. The PSC denied the interim increase, and subsequently allowed the carriers an overall rate raise of 5 per cent on non-construction hauling and 10 per cent on jobs related to construction.

General commodities carriers were permitted an increase of 3.5 per cent on loads of less than 5,000 pounds and 2 per cent on shipments of more than 5,000 pounds. Those increases made Missouri intrastate rates equal to interstate charges approved earlier by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The Commission's authority over the safety of railroad operations was enhanced last year when the PSC elected to participate in a new federal safety program for railroads. This will not replace the PSC's own safety work, but will augment it by giving the Commission the power to enforce federal regulations within the state. In return, the federal government will contribute money to the state to defray some of the expenses of the program.

Under the Federal Railroad Safety Act, the first rules promulgated are those governing track and roadbed safety standards, which will be adopted by the PSC. Additional rules covering other aspects of railroad operations will be adopted by the Missouri Commission as they are issued by the Federal Railroad Administration.

Legislation passed by the Missouri General Assembly in 1971 instructed the PSC to draw up regulations to improve the safety of railroads in the state. The PSC has conducted studies and investigations of the need for additional regulations, and is confident the federal rules will be in harmony with the intent of the General Assembly. The PSC may issue additional regulations to supplement the federal criteria if they are consistent and compatible with them, and may adopt rules varying from the federal regulations in order to eliminate hazards created by local conditions.

The purpose of the federal program, and Missouri's participation in it, is to ensure uniformity of safety standards throughout the United States. Safety efforts in the past have been handicapped by variations in rules from state to state.

Authority given to the Public Service Commission by the General Assembly in 1972 to use state money for the improvement of protection at grade crossings was first exercised by the PSC during the 1972-73 fiscal year. A total of \$167,206 was withdrawn from the fund for installation of additional protection at 10 grade crossings in Missouri. The funds are used by the PSC to pay up to 90 per cent of the share of the state, counties or cities in providing grade crossing protection if no federal funds are available. Revenues from the fund are derived from one-half of the income from the state's 3 per cent tax on railroad car rentals. The money is to be used only on those grade crossings which the Commission finds are highly dangerous.

To foster the development of computer use in regulation, the Public Service Commission sponsors the Regulatory Information Systems Conference, which is attended by representatives from state and federal regulatory commissions, utilities and others interested in regulation. The conference, in addition to presenting programs on electronic data processing, is a forum for discussion of contemporary issues in regulation. This year's conference, the fourth, will be held September 10-12 in St. Louis.

The Commission maintains statistics gathered throughout the state on grade crossing accidents, and reported that for calendar year 1972 the number of accidents, as well as the number of deaths and injuries in this type of accident declined. There were 171 accidents, compared to 178 in the preceding year, with a drop from 50 to 42 in the total of fatalities. The number of non-fatal injuries declined substantially, from 145 to 114.

Electronic data processing is being used by the Public Service Commission to obtain information from regulation companies and organize data rapidly for use in investigations and rate proceedings. The Missouri Commission is a leader among regulatory agencies in the United States in experimenting with the computer to use its potential fully.

At present, the PSC is converting its transportation files to make them compatible with electronic data processing, and consequently more accessible to PSC personnel, law enforcement agencies and others interested in the transportation industry. The first phase of the project, the conversion of the insurance files, is expected to be completed in April, 1974, and the target date for complete conversion in June, 1975. The project is being carried out jointly with the Missouri Highway Patrol, on whose computer the information will be kept. The Public Service Commission has no computer, but uses EDP equipment in the Office of Management Systems and the State Highway Commission.

The Commission is now using computers to expedite the auditing of companies, and as an aid in determining firms' returns on investment and other financial information. The Office of Economic Research publishes each year analyses of electric, gas, telephone and water utilities throughout the United States which contain financial and operating data correlated by electronic data processing.

The number of cases filed with the Commission during the fiscal year was 2,270, slightly above the total for the previous fiscal year of 2,199. Hearings were conducted in 849 cases, compared to 911 the year before. The total duration of hearings was about the same in both years. A total of 1,035 hours was spent in hearings during the most recent fiscal year, compared to 1,088 in the earlier year. A total of 33,358 pages of transcript was filed in the 1972-73 fiscal year, while the total in the 1971-72 fiscal year was 34,766. The Commission issued a total of 7,027 orders during the latest fiscal year, compared to 7,545 for the year earlier.

Utility companies filed a total of 5,203 tariffs with the Commission during the 1972-73 fiscal year,

a large increase over the previous year's total of 3,950. The number of complaints brought to the Commission by consumers continued to increase, to 1,498, as against the total for the year earlier of 1,239. There were 310 field investigations of complaints compared to the total the year before of 495. In responding to complaints, tariff filings and requests for information, the Commission and staff wrote 6,624 letters, compared to 6,800 during the previous year. The number of telephone calls, conferences and interviews in regard to complaints increased tremendously, from 7,450 in 1971-72 to 14,314 for the period of this report.

The Engineering Department undertook 117 gas safety inspections of the 21 gas distribution utilities, compared to 85 in the previous year, contacting each several times throughout the year. A total of 11 investigations of gas incidents was made, down from 16 the year before.

Four company appraisals were made by the Engineering Department during the fiscal year, two more than in the earlier fiscal year, and completed 23 depreciation rate studies, almost double the total of 12 last year. The department took part in 16 rate cases before the Commission, five more than in the year earlier. Orders issued by the Engineering Department concerning electrical undergrounding authority totaled 255, compared to 238 during the previous year. Seven such orders were issued on telephone undergrounding, a requirement that was introduced during this fiscal year. Authority orders on promotional practices were considerably fewer, totaling seven as against 47 in the 1971-72 year.

The railroad safety section conducted 161 railroad yard and building inspections, compared to 104 during the previous year. Grade crossing inspections totaled 528, up from 479 the year earlier. Railroad equipment inspections totaled 21, against 75 during the previous year. Inspections of railroad accidents totaled 34, while in the previous year there were four. There were 92 meetings with railroad officials, compared to 38 last year, and 91 meetings with public officials, compared to 49 during the year before. A total of 591 industrial track inspections were made, an increase of 276 over the last fiscal year. Miscellaneous inspections increased from 74 to 111.

Tariffs and schedules filed during the fiscal year for bus, railroad, railway express and truck companies totaled 6,968, down slightly from the 1971-72 total of 7,045.

The operating rights of 559 truck operators were revoked during the fiscal year for failure to comply with Commission requirements, compared to 458 the year before. Inspectors in the enforcement section of the Transportation Office drove 192,000 accident-free miles, 60,000 miles more than last year, in the performance of their duties and contacted 3,557 carriers, considerably more than the total of 2,950 in 1971-72. Safety inspections increase, also, from 5,479 to 6,617. Of those vehicles inspected, 273 were taken out of service until deficiencies were corrected.

Investigations of unlawful operations almost doubled, from 361 to 618. Accident investigations totaled 23, compared with 170 in the previous years. A total of 286 inspections of bus stations for compliance with cleanliness and safety rules were made, up from the total of 172 in the past year.

Insurance cancellations caused the suspension of 1,752 carriers during the fiscal year, compared with 1,688 the year before. A total of 1,046 carriers were reinstated upon filing notice of proper insurance.

The Commission approved during the fiscal year the issuance of capital securities by companies under its jurisdiction with a total value of \$504,140,583. Of that total, \$443,784,000 of the securities were issued to refund outstanding indebtedness. The remaining \$60,356,583 represented new capital securities. Table A shows the type and amount of the various securities issued. Authority fees are assessed by the Commission subsequent to the issuance of the PSC order authorizing the issuance of securities. During the fiscal year, authority and miscellaneous fees of \$15,258 and \$27,014, respectively, were collected. These fees are credited directly to the State General Revenue Fund.

The Public Service Commission budget is appropriated by the General Assembly from the Public Service Commission Fund and the State Highway Department Fund. The PSC Fund is supported by assessments against the regulated utilities on the basis of the companies' gross revenues during the prior year. The assessments for the 1973-74 fiscal year totaled \$1,686,028, compared with \$1,600,820 for the previous year. A breakdown of the assessments is shown in Table B. Any balance in the PSC Fund after the budget is appropriated is carried over to the next fiscal year.

The portion of the PSC money in the State Highway Department Fund is obtained through the sales of motor carrier license stickers. These totaled \$1,364,370 during the fiscal year compared to \$1,209,612 in the year earlier. Any balance in this fund after the budget is appropriated is absorbed into general highway funds. The sale of license stickers by month and type of carrier is shown in Table C.
