UTILITY REGULATORY AUDITOR I-II-III-IV

State regulatory agency seeks to fill Utility Regulatory Auditor I-II-III-IV positions to perform analysis related to energy issues that affect Missouri's investor owned electric utilities and their customers.

These are responsible professional auditing positions that require a high degree of technical and substantive knowledge related to utility regulation, accounting, regulatory auditing and electric utility resource planning. The employees in these positions must be able to handle complex and multiple audit areas. The employees will be responsible for reviewing filings and performing prudence audits related to electric utility resource planning, fuel adjustment clause rate adjustments, fuel adjustment clause true-ups, utility rate design, energy efficiency programs, and energy efficiency investment mechanisms.

Starting salary will be commensurate with education and experience. Experience in a regulatory environment that provides a broad view of utility regulation, utility operations, cost evaluation and management analysis is preferred. Familiarity with energy resources, technologies and standards a plus. Applicants must possess good communication and interpersonal skills. Computer experience required with a working knowledge of Microsoft Office preferred. Some travel required.

Qualified candidates for **Utility Regulatory Auditor I** position must possess a four-year degree from an accredited college or university with specialization in accounting, finance, economics, business or public administration or closely related area and must also have a minimum of twenty-four semester hours of accounting or finance coursework. The starting annual salary for a Utility Regulator Auditor I is \$38,304 with a potential increase at the end of a successful probationary period.

Qualified candidates for the **Utility Regulatory Auditor II** must meet the minimum educational requirements of the Auditor I in addition to the requirements of one or more years of experience as a Utility Regulatory Auditor I with the Missouri Public Service Commission **or** two or more years of professional auditing experience, including one or more years in a regulatory environment that provides a broad view of regulation, utility operations, cost evaluation, and management analysis. The starting annual salary for a Utility Regulator Auditor II is \$40,416 with a potential increase at the end of a successful probationary period.

Qualified candidates for the **Utility Regulatory Auditor III** must meet the minimum educational requirements of the Auditor I in addition to the requirements of one or more years of experience as a Utility Regulatory Auditor II with the Missouri Public Service Commission **or** three or more years of professional auditing experience, including two or more years in a regulatory environment that provides a broad view of regulation, utility operations, cost evaluation, and management analysis. The starting annual salary for a Utility Regulatory Auditor III is \$47,868 with a potential increase at the end of a successful probationary period.

Qualified candidates for the **Utility Regulatory Auditor IV** must meet the minimum educational requirements of the Auditor I in addition to the requirements of one or more years of experience as a Utility Regulatory Auditor III with the Missouri Public Service Commission **or** four or more years of professional auditing experience, including three or more years in a regulatory environment that provides a broad view of regulation, utility operations, cost evaluation, and management analysis. The starting annual salary for a Utility Regulatory Auditor IV is \$53,136 with a potential increase at the end of a successful probationary period.
