UTILITY REGULATORY AUDITOR IV

State regulatory agency seeks to fill Utility Regulatory Auditor IV position to perform analysis related to energy issues that affect Missouri's investor owned utilities and their customers.

This is a highly responsible professional auditing position that requires a high degree of technical and substantive knowledge in utility regulation, accounting, and regulatory auditing. The employee in this position must demonstrate expertise in utility regulation and independently handle highly complex and multiple audit areas. The employee will be responsible for reviewing filings related to electric utilities including electric utility resource planning, fuel adjustment clause rate adjustments, and demand-side programs; and for performing prudence reviews of costs and revenues related to fuel adjustment clauses and demand-side programs investment mechanisms.

Qualified candidates must have a minimum of four years of professional auditing experience, of which three years must have been in a regulatory environment that provides a broad view of regulation, utility operations, cost evaluation and management analysis and a bachelor's degree in accounting, finance, economics, business or public administration or a closely related area, including or supplemented by twenty-four semester hours of accounting or finance coursework. Applicants must possess good communication and interpersonal skills. Personal computer experience required, with working knowledge of Microsoft Office preferred. Some travel required.

Annual salary range: \$53,136 - \$57,648.
