



As the complainant, OPC has the burden of proof.<sup>1</sup> Further, the Commission is mindful of the rate case Respondents must file by April 2017. If the Commission finds in favor of Respondents' schedule but ultimately finds in favor of OPC on the merits of the case, any change in rates due to that decision would have very little effect. Thus, the Commission will adopt OPC's proposed timeline.<sup>2</sup>
