**ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE**

On July 25, 2016, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed notice of the start of its second MEEIA prudence audit of the costs associated with Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri’s Demand Side Investment Mechanism. The Commission issued notice and set a September 12 deadline for the filing of applications to intervene.

The Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers (“MIEC”), a nonprofit corporation representing the interest of industrial customers, filed a timely application to intervene. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(13) grants parties ten days from the date of a filing to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. No objections to MIEC’s application were received. Upon review of the unopposed application, the Commission finds MIEC meets the standards for granting an application to intervene established in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3).

Therefore, the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The application by the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers to intervene is granted.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
