**ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE, SETTING  
INTERVENTION DEADLINE, AND MAKING  
ONVOY SPECTRUM, LLC A PARTY**

This order provides notice of this application to interested parties, establishes a deadline for intervention and for requesting a hearing, and joins the other party to the interconnection agreement, Onvoy Spectrum, LLC (“Onvoy”), as a party to this proceeding.

On July 18, 2017, CenturyTel of Missouri, Inc. d/b/a CenturyLink and Spectra Communications Group, LLC d/b/a CenturyLink (CenturyLink) filed an application with the Commission for approval of a negotiated Commercial Mobile Radio Services (CMRS) Interconnection Agreement with Onvoy under the provisions of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996. CenturyLink states that there are no unresolved issues and that the agreement complies with Section 252(e) of the Act in that it is consistent with the public interest, convenient and necessary, and is not discriminatory to nonparty carriers.

Although Onvoy is a party to the agreement, it did not join in the application. Because Onvoy is a necessary party to a full and fair adjudication of this matter, the Commission will add Onvoy as a party to this case.

The Act provides that an interconnection agreement must be approved unless the state commission finds that the agreement discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement, or that implementation of the agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.<sup>1</sup> Section 252(e)(4) of the Act provides that if the Commission has not approved an agreement within 90 days after submission, the agreement shall be deemed approved. The Commission finds that proper persons shall be allowed 15 days from the issuance of this order to file a motion for hearing. The Commission also finds that notice of this application shall be sent to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Commission's Data Center shall send notice to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies.
2. Onvoy Spectrum, LLC is made a party to this case.
3. Any party wishing to intervene or request a hearing shall do so by filing a pleading no later than August 4, 2017, with:

4. The Staff of the Commission shall file a recommendation advising either approval or rejection of this agreement and giving the reasons therefor no later than August 17, 2017.

5. This order shall be effective when issued.
