ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed its 2018 Demand-Side Program Annual Report on May 29, 2019. On May 29, the Midwest Energy Consumers Group (MECG) applied to intervene. More than ten days have passed since MECG applied to intervene and no party has responded to that application.¹

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(9) allows interested stakeholders, such as MECG, 30 days to file comments about Ameren Missouri's report. Parts of that report were filed as confidential under the Commission's confidential information rule, 4 CSR 240-2.135. A provision of that rule, 4 CSR 240-2.135(6), allows confidential information to be disclosed to the attorney of record for a party to a case, as well as to subject-matter experts for those parties. MECG will need to be a party to this case to be able to view that confidential information.

Granting party status to MECG is the best way to control disclosure of the confidential information filed by Ameren Missouri. For that reason, the Commission finds that allowing MECG to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Application to Intervene of the Midwest Energy Consumers Group is granted.
 - 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
